From the Principal,

Dear Members of the La Salle Community,

We had a very successful Mission Aid Day last Friday 14 May. It was pleasing to see a number of our students actively involved in the whole school Para Liturgy which was held in the Laurence Murphy Gymnasium. The focus was very much on the under privileged youth in our society today.

After the Para Liturgy the students and staff organised various stalls and activities to raise money for Boystown. The afternoon celebration was our student concert. I congratulate all the students who performed on the stage and the student body for the support and encouragement given to their fellow students.

We returned to school that evening for the student social. The students enjoyed the music and appeared to have a good night. As I drove out of the car park at 9.00 pm that evening, I felt very positive about how we as a school community celebrated Mission Aid Day. At this stage we have raised in excess of approximately \$12,000 a fantastic result.



YEAR 12 TEE ART
