**PARENT/TEENAGER RELATIONSHIPS**

The adolescent years can be stormy. Our sons and daughters can lose their tempers over almost nothing. Trouble can often start when parents get angry too.

Here are some possible ways of keeping the lines of communication open when your son or daughter is angry.

- Don't respond in kind. Adolescents know how to push our buttons. But when parents get angry back, it can be like pouring gas on a hot fire. Rather than exploding, try walking away. If your son/daughter doesn't have anyone to fight with, the anger will go away more quickly.
- Actions really do speak louder than words. If you respond while you're angry, your teenager isn't going to hear what you say. Instead he/she will focus on the fact you lost your temper.
- Think about what you can control. At the time your son or daughter is blowing up, there's not much you can do about it. You can control your own behaviour though if you can stay calm, you can start to listen to what your teenager is really saying.
- Talk when the worst is over. Once your son's or daughter's anger starts to subside say "lets talk". That's a time when both of you can open up to talk about what's going on.
- Try to spend time with your son/daughter when he/she isn't angry. You have to make the first move. Invite your son/daughter to the footy/netball etc. These positive times will help you build a relationship based on trust. Over time, they will help define the anger.
