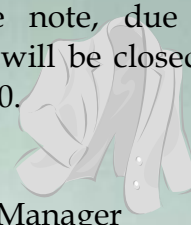

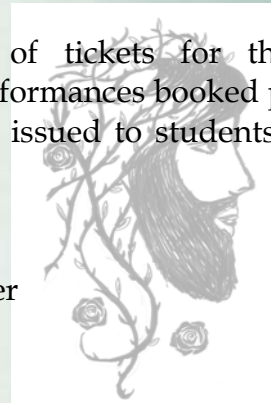

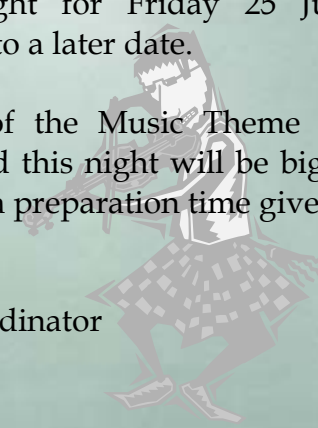


MUSIC APOLOGIES
