From the Principal,

Dear Members of the La Salle Community,

YEAR 10 FOOD AND CULTURE GATEAUS

Throughout Term 2 the Year 10 Food classes have been investigating and experimenting with different methods of making cakes and decorating techniques, in preparation for designing our own gateaus. One of the first steps was to research different methods of cooking sponges. We conducted a sponge trial lesson, then chose the best method and made our own sponges that we would later use for our own gateau. Ms Lennon took us for the next lesson, demonstrating the various techniques of decorating. Following Ms Lennon's demonstration we used her tips and techniques to create our own sample decorated sponge, which helped us finalise the design we would later use on our own gateau.

To many students, the making of their gateau wasn't as easy as they initially expected, but for others their level of achievement really exceeded their expectations. But all in all, students found the experience to be fun and enjoyable while improving their knowledge and cooking skills.
