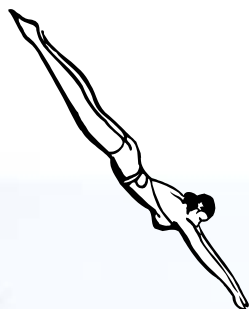
Parents and students in our squad are asked to note the following:

Two games have been played in recent weeks with vastly different results. Firstly against John Forrest on an interesting turf wicket, La Salle bowled extremely well to limit the opposition to 6/134 off 35 overs. Fine economical bowling from *Chris Marshall* 6/1/1/10. Also *Ben Stockden* and *Michael Parry* snared 2 wickets each in tight bowling spells. Our batting faltered and only *Michael Turkich* 19, *Ryan Hampson* 13 and *Ben Stockden* 13 showed any real resistance, as we were bundled out for 94 in 28 overs.

The second game saw a resounding victory with a total 2 runs shy of the Lasallian record score. A highlight was the 32 boundaries in the innings which included 12 sixes. We were at home to Wanneroo and the boys blazed away to score 8/248. *Matt Burton* bludgeoned 51(48), *Michael Turkich* 31(44) and *Ryan Hampson* was ruthless in scoring 68(45) including 7 fours and 3 sixes.
