PARTNERSHIP WITH MIDLAND TAFE

A partnership with Midland TAFE has been established enabling a group of our Year 11 and 12 students to complete a course in Arc Welding. Students who elect to enrol in this course and who meet the course requirements will be awarded the nationally recognised Unit of Competency in Arc Welding - MEM 5.12AB. Students will also receive recognition for having attained this competency on their Final Statement of Results issued by the Curriculum Council. Students who would be eligible to enrol in this course would be Year 11 and 12 students who are not required at the College during Week 6 of this Term for any examinations. This is an excellent opportunity for students to achieve a nationally recognised competency in welding whilst also gaining valuable experience in the TAFE education system. If your son or daughter would like to apply to enrol in this course, they should contact Mr Pepper.

MISSION AID DAY

Mission Aid Day gives an opportunity for the College community to enjoy a day of meaning, fellowship and fun. The College gives an opportunity for the students to come to school in a relaxed manner. The dress code for the day is termed 'free dress'. In keeping with the values of the College on dress standards, students are reminded of what is stated in the College Diary on page 28. It states: Any sanctioned 'Free' Dress Day needs to be carefully managed by students. Students need to dress in a fairly conservative way, e.g. no mid-riffs exposed, skirts and shorts not too short and non revealing tops. Messages and symbols on clothing that are against the ethos of the College are not acceptable. In addition, footwear needs to be appropriate to the types of activities presented for safety reasons. Rubber thongs are not considered to be acceptable footwear. The majority of our students will comply admirably with these regulations. However, those students who choose not to accept this standard will not be able to participate in any of the day's activities.
