RECONCILIATION WEEK

Reconciliation week has run from 27 May to 3 June, with dates highlighting two significant achievements in the history of the Indigenous people of Australia. The national call for Reconciliation came in the wake of the Royal Commission into Aboriginal deaths in Custody and 3 June was the date when the Mabo Court decision was made.

2005 marks the 10th anniversary of the establishment of National Reconciliation Week and it's the 50th Anniversary of the Great Bridge walks of 2000.

This year's theme is Reconciliation: Take the next step. This is what Pope John Paul II said to the Indigenous people he spoke to in Alice Springs in 1986:

"You have learned how to survive, whether on your own lands or scattered among the towns and cities. Though your difficulties are not yet over, you must learn to draw on the endurance which your ancient ceremonies have taught you. Endurance brings with it patience; patience helps you find the way ahead, and gives you courage for your journey. Take heart....."

May we all seek to be agents of God's justice, love and reconciliation.
