For our senior students it has no doubt been a challenging time. ### **SEMESTER REPORTS**

The staff are currently engaged in preparing Semester Reports for students as well as continuing with their normal teaching program. Reporting a student's progress is an integral component of the teaching and learning process and it is imperative that the information provided in the report is clear, concise and accurate.
