Ms De Filippi wasn't lying when she told us that people from all over the city make their way to the Re Store for their renowned Italian rolls. We saw the queues with our own eyes! The Re Store was my second favourite shop because all the people there were really nice and helpful; also because of all the wonderful Italian foods, goods and gifts they sell. Quite a few of the students in my class bought Baci chocolates to enjoy on our way home.
