DID YOU KNOW?

John Baptist De La Salle had the idea of setting up gratuitous schools where the children of workmen and the poor would learn reading, writing and arithmetic and would also receive a Christian education through catechisms and other forms of instruction appropriate for forming good Christians. For this purpose he brought together a group of young unmarried men. The history of our Institute, since then, has seen the Brothers move beyond France to 85 countries. Today, the Brothers minister together with over 60,000 lay colleagues, to more than 7000,000 students.

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
