**STRATEGIC PLANNING PROCESS**

Our strategic planning process is now underway. As a result of the work undertaken over the next few months the College will develop a Strategic Plan which will give direction to the Board and wider community regarding the type of school we want to see as the foundation of La Salle.

On Wednesday evening, a small but enthusiastic group of parents met with our facilitator, Dr Liz Pattison, to provide some insights into their hopes and dreams for La Salle College. On Thursday afternoon the first of our three staff consultations was held. During the coming weeks students, ex-students and the surrounding parishes will also be consulted to get the broadest possible base for our planning into the future.

Accompanying this Delagram is a survey which has been compiled by Liz Pattison inviting all parents to have a direct say into what they think about the College and very importantly, what changes and new initiatives you would like to see introduced. I would strongly urge you to take a few moments to complete this questionnaire and return it to me by 22 June.

**YEAR 11 AND 12 EXAMS**

Our senior students are currently undertaking their Semester One exams. On Wednesday, all of our Year 11 students sat the General Achievement Test which is an assessment common to all schools in the state. The results of this test will be used to assist the staff in making judgements regarding levels related to the introduction of the new Courses of Study.

Students who are not undertaking university bound courses are spending the two week examination period in work experience. Apart from the acquisition of practical skills, this work experience is very useful in gaining credit for TAFE entry.

I wish all of our students sitting these exams all the very best and hope that the results that they achieve are a true reflection of the effort and commitment that they have made to their studies.

### SUPPORTIVE SCHOOLS PROJECT

#### Understanding Discipline

The aim of discipline should be to guide adolescents to take responsibility for their own behaviour.

#### WHAT HAPPENS AT SCHOOL?

Our school has a behaviour management plan designed to create a positive and safe school environment. These plans are designed to encourage adolescents to take responsibility for their own actions and develop self-discipline. The behaviour management plan informs parents, teachers and students what is expected and outlines rewards and consequences of behaviour. Students are reminded of the contractual agreement they signed with La Salle College when they enrolled. This agreement is in their school organisers, along with other information that assists our communication with you about respectful and responsible behaviours expected from all members of this College.

#### WHAT CAN PARENTS DO?

By working in conjunction with the school, parents can provide their son or daughter with consistent expectations and boundaries both at school and at home.

When family rules have been set ask your son or daughter to tell you the rules in his/her words.

- Set consistent firm limits and rules. Adolescents like to know where they stand.
- Be consistent with consequences and rewards.
- Acknowledge good behaviour.
- Model desired behaviours to your son or daughter.
- Supervise your son or daughter so you know where he/she is and what he/she is doing.
- Become familiar with your school's behaviour management plan so your son or daughter sees you are actively involved.
- Show lots of love and affection. You are the most important person in your son or daughter's life and your time and attention is the most powerful reward you can give him/her.
