

Senior Leadership Team Notices

IMPORTANT 'NEW' STUDENT FORMS

Parents and students are asked to be aware of two 'new' forms that are now in use at the College.

Application for Extended Leave

A form is now available for students who, for exceptional circumstances, need to apply for extended leave from their educational programme at the College. This form is available from student reception and needs to be completed at least one month prior to the intended absence from the College. Students need to return the completed form to the relevant Year Coordinator.

Student Clearance Form

Parents are required to notify the Principal in writing when students are withdrawing from enrolment at the College. Once the Principal is notified of a student's intention to leave, the student is then required to obtain a 'Student Clearance Form' which is available from student reception. Students need to return the completed form to the relevant Year Coordinator. Please note that one term's notice is required on withdrawal of a student from the College before the end of the year. If notice is not given of early withdrawal of a student, a term's fee is payable in lieu of notice.

School Leaving Age

Legislation to increase the school leaving age to 16 years of age in 2006 and 17 years of age in 2008 was passed by the WA Parliament in 2005. The legislation requires parents to notify their intent and /or seek approval from the Minister for Education and Training to allow their child to participate in any activity other than full-time attendance at a school until the end of the year in which that child turns 16. Any parent requiring further information or the relevant application forms should contact Mr Pepper at the College.
