PARENTS OF YEAR TEN STUDENTS

This year your child will have commenced their Year 10 Tutorial classes and in these classes the students are required to explore and work towards achieving their goals. During this week's lesson, each student was asked to write a letter to you that incorporated the following:

As a sign of your commitment to your goals, write a letter home to your parent/s informing them of your plans, dreams, hopes and goals.

The letter should include details about:

- i. the short-term goals you have set for yourself in Year 10 - what do you hope to achieve, what do you need to change, how are you going to perform?
- ii. the medium-term goals you have set for yourself in the next few years - do you plan on graduating from Year 12, do you plan on looking for an apprenticeship/work/ TAFE course at the end of Year 10, 11 or 12 (if so, in what particular field i.e. mechanics, hairdressing, plumbing...)?
- iii. the long-term goals you have set for yourself - outline your career goals and what you have to do in order to achieve them.

Each student has been asked to take this letter home to their parents so that you as their parents and as part of their support structure are able to see what their hopes, dreams and ambitions are for the short and long term future. Please read these letters and use them as a guide to support and guide your student as the year progresses.


