**OPENING OF OUR NEW BUILDINGS**

Last Friday evening marked an important milestone in the history of the College with the opening of the Br Eric Pigott Performing Arts Centre and the Clement Mulcahy Wing. It was wonderful that both Br Eric and Clement were able to be with us to share in this celebration.

Such a huge occasion does not happen without the efforts and commitment of many people. I would like to thank Bishop Don Sproston for blessing our new facilities and joining with us to make our celebrations even more special. I would also like to record my thanks to the Director of Catholic Education, Ron Dullard, a foundation student of this College, for sharing in the opening of our buildings. It is also great to have a number of the CEO Assistant Directors with us on the evening, including Michael Ciccarelli, a former Principal of La Salle, and Debra Sayce, a previous Deputy Principal of La Salle.

The genesis of the project which saw the construction of our new facilities commenced during Michael Ciccarelli's time as Principal. This was then continued during Michael Kenny's tenure as Principal. Board members during this period, and in particular our Board Chair, Peter Naylor and College Treasurer, Daryl Burton, also need to be acknowledged for their foresight and management of College finances enabling the College to undertake such a significant project.

### INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

International Women's Day has been celebrated in Western Australia since 1928. Helena College hosted a breakfast on 8 March with speakers addressing the theme, 'Reaching for Rights and Recognition'. Shenae Burton and Tara Franzinelli represented La Salle College, and together with other young women from local secondary schools, enjoyed a sumptuous breakfast prepared by the Year 11 Catering students, while listening to the first hand accounts of two local women and their life journeys. Both speakers work for the *Street Doctor* program, taking medical expertise into the disadvantaged areas of Perth.

Dr Teresa Tierney inspired the audience with her journey to become a medical practitioner, owner of a medical practice, as well as being a mother and bringing up a family. She encouraged the young women to set goals and stay focused, not to compare themselves to others and not to be put off by their peers as they strive to achieve their goals. Margaret Wayland-Peck spoke about her forty years in nursing, bringing up a large family (six children) and her recent achievement of completing two years study at Curtin University to graduate as a Nurse Practitioner. She returned to tertiary study because of the clinical specialisation the course offered. Her message to the audience was "whatever you do, do it well and enjoy it". Flautist Kate Aldham, a Year 12 Helena College student, and Jane Darcy, a classical guitar tutor, entertained the audience with a selection of South American musical renditions.
