SPIRITUAL GUIDANCE
REFLECTION FOR 5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

A poem to sit with

*“Be kind to yourself, take care of yourself, some people walk their dogs and
buy them presents, and take better care of them than they do their own selves.*

Be kind to others even if they upset you.

*Remember, I made them too, and be good to your mother and father
remember, they make mistakes too and I love them as I love you.”*

Scripture: *John 13:31-35*

“Jesus said: ...A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

Meditation: *As I have loved you:* This Sunday's gospel passage begins the very lengthy, “Last Discourse” or “Farewell Speech”, which Jesus addresses to the disciples at the Last Supper. The parallel wording links the two acts: “as I have done/loved . . . you also should...” There are two characteristics to the love with which disciples are to love one another. First, the standard and model of love, is Jesus himself: “As I have loved you . . .”. This is a love we can understand. Jesus learned what love is and he gave it without reserve on the cross. It hurt his hands. It took his life. The beauty of the pain and death he incurred for others is filled with quiet glory.

Again, chapter 13 begins with this notice: Jesus “loved his own in the world and he loved them to the end”: “the end,” of course, is his death. Thus, the love demonstrated in the foot washing anticipates Jesus' ultimate act of love on the cross. This is what is “new” about the command: it is Jesus himself, in his life, service, and self-giving unto death, who models what it means to love one another. Secondly, on a practical level, disciples express love in service to one another. This is different to the once-for-all love of Jesus on the cross and, in a sense, is harder because such service requires a daily laying down of one's wishes, needs, and desires for the sake of the other.

There is one final aspect of this love. It is not exclusively for the mutual benefit of disciples. Rather, “This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another”. In other words, love is a vehicle for evangelization, announcing to all people a new way of life characterized by love. We are keen on underscoring obligation - we must “love one another.” This is only possible because of the power and grace which come from our first being loved by God. The norm of our love is not to be self-love, but the self-sacrificing love of Jesus. It is this kind of love which makes “all things new”. Can we love each other as Jesus loved us? We may hurt our hands, but we will be part of his glory. Love, and say it with your life.

Senior Leadership Team Notices

STUDENT FREE DAY - FRIDAY, 1 JUNE

The College has been advised by the Catholic Education Office that staff will be required to attend professional development seminars on Friday June 1st 2007 for new courses being introduced by the Curriculum Council in 2008/09. This professional development was scheduled for earlier in first term, however, due to delays experienced by the Curriculum Council the day has been rescheduled. Parents are advised that Friday June 1st 2007 will now be a student free day.

STUDENT DEPARTURES

Parents are required to notify the Principal in writing when students are terminating their enrolment at the College. Parents are also reminded that in accordance with the College Enrolment Agreement, one term's notice is required prior to the withdrawal of a student from the College before the end of the year. If a term's notice is not given, a term's fee is payable in lieu of notice.

SCHOOL LEAVING AGE

As mentioned in previous Delagrams, legislation to increase the school leaving age to 16 years of age in 2006 and 17 years of age in 2008 was passed by the WA Parliament in 2005. Currently, the legislation requires parents to notify their intent and /or seek approval from the Minister for Education and Training to allow their child to participate in any activity other than full-time attendance at a school **until the end of the year in which their child turns 16.**

Year 11 students who wish to apply for an apprenticeship or traineeship during the year must see Mr Pepper for the relevant application form. This form needs to be forwarded to the Department of Education and Training for approval prior to a student accepting a position.
