MARRIAGE: "An authentic conjugal love, merging the human and the divine, leads the spouses to a free and mutual gift of themselves, a gift providing itself by gentle affection, and by deed; such love pervades the whole of their lives, growing better and growing greater by its generosity." Marriage is the intimate, exclusive, indissoluble communion of life and love entered by man and woman at the design of the Creator for the purpose of their own good and the procreation and education of children; this covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament.

Intimate communion of life and love: Marriage is the closest and most intimate of human friendships. It involves the sharing of the whole of a person's life with his/her spouse. Marriage calls for a mutual self-surrender so intimate and complete that spouses – without losing their individuality – become "one," not only in body, but in soul. **Exclusive communion of life and love:** As a mutual gift of two persons to each other, this intimate union excludes such union with anyone else. It demands the total fidelity of the spouses. This exclusivity is essential for the good of the couple's children as well.

Indissoluble communion of life and love: Husband and wife are not joined by passing emotion or mere erotic inclination which, selfishly pursued, fades quickly away. They are joined in authentic conjugal love by the firm and irrevocable act of their own will. Once their mutual consent has been consummated by genital intercourse, an unbreakable bond is established between the spouses. For the baptized, this bond is sealed by the Holy Spirit and becomes absolutely indissoluble. Thus, the Church does not so much teach that divorce is wrong, but that divorce is impossible, regardless of its civil implications.

Entered by man and woman: The complementarity of the sexes is essential to marriage. There is such widespread confusion today about the nature of marriage that some would wish to extend a legal "right" to marry to two persons of the same sex. The very nature of marriage makes such a proposition impossible.

For the purpose of their own good: "It is not good that the man should be alone" (Gn 2:18). Conversely, it's for their own good, for their benefit, enrichment, and ultimately their salvation, that a man and woman join their lives in marriage. Marriage is the most basic expression of the vocation to love that all men and women have as persons made in God's image. **And the procreation and education of children:** "By their very nature, the institution of marriage itself and conjugal love are ordained for the procreation and education of children and find in them their ultimate crown." Children are not added on to marriage and conjugal love, but spring from the very heart of the spouses mutual self-giving, as its fruit and fulfillment. Intentional exclusion of children, then, contradicts the very nature and purpose of marriage.

Covenant: While marriage involves a legal contract, this must be subordinate to the spousal covenant which provides a stronger, more sacred framework for marriage. A covenant goes beyond the minimum rights and responsibilities guaranteed by a contract. A covenant calls the spouses to share in the free total, faithful, and fruitful love of God. For it is God who, in the image of his own Covenant with his people, joins the spouses in a more binding and sacred way than any human contract.

The Job Seekers' Seminar was conducted by the charismatic Chris Maxwell from "Motivation Development Programs of Australia." The day was designed to prepare our students for the workforce by allowing them to be exposed to the expectations of employers and the workforce in general. A number of employers, including several members of the College Board including Mr Gino Perrella and Mr Lou Muriale helped out in the interview section. The venue was the College Auditorium and Gymnasium. On the day, the students:

- Made their own way to the seminar venue (as they would be expected to do if they were attending an actual job interview);
- Learnt valuable techniques in preparation for their first interview;
- Role played job interviews with a range of actual employers selected from a diverse cross-section of professions, and;
- Learnt valuable techniques for resume design, using the telephone, personal presentation and communication.

As with attendance at any interview, the students were expected to present themselves in formal attire (eg: shirt, tie and trousers for boys, skirt and top for girls). The standard of dress was fantastic. Thank you to the students and families for making such a great effort.

YEAR 12 TEE REVISION SEMINARS AT LA SALLE COLLEGE

Dear students and parents

Please be informed of a number of opportunities for students to access TEE revision seminars here at La Salle College this year. Staff from “Hands on Tuition” are conducting these seminars. Whilst La Salle is providing the venue for these seminars, the seminars are being run totally by the Hands on Tuition staff members; as such La Salle will not be providing staff to supervise the students for these seminars.

TEE revision seminars are to be conducted over a number of weekends of Term 3. The subjects for which these seminars will be offered are Accounting, Applicable Mathematics, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Discrete Mathematics, Economics, English, Geography, History, Human Biology and Physics.

The courses will be run over two sessions of three hours at a cost of \$70 per subject (this price is less than what you would be charged if you went directly to Hands on Tuition Revision Seminars for the same length of time).

A group of twenty five footballers and four staff arrived on Wednesday, 27 June to spend a week with us. For most of the group it was their first time in Western Australia and definitely the first time being billeted by our host families. It was interesting to observe the group as their names were called out to meet their host families, it was evident that any concerns they may have had rapidly disappeared as they left the Laurence Murphy Hall.

Their trip included visiting Kings Park, our beaches, the shopping precinct in the city, and the West Coast Eagles training facilities. They also trained with and played a match against the highly rated Clontarf Aboriginal College's team on Friday, 29 June at Fremantle Oval. By all accounts it was a great match with the De La Salle boys comfortably winning the match by some 7 goals. I was fortunate enough to go with them to Subiaco Oval to watch the NAB Cup Under 18s match between Western Australia and Victoria Metro; the WA players were much too strong on the day and our 2006 ex student, Luke Pratt put in a quality effort in defence for WA.

On Monday afternoon, 2 July, we prepared to take on the De La Salle team, on a very wet and water logged oval. We knew this would be a very tough assignment. We dominated play in the first quarter and unfortunately were only able to register points instead of goals. De La Salle dominated the second and third quarters as they showed us how to play quality football in the wet conditions. The final quarter was evenly matched until the game was called off due to an approaching thunderstorm.

Their stay culminated with an official dinner after the match in the Laurence Murphy Hall, following the dinner, presentation of the Brother Eric Piggott perpetual trophy was presented to the Captain of their team and the best player trophies went to Matt Wall from De La Salle and Simon Parry from our team.
