FROM THE PRINCIPAL

WELCOME TO TERM 3

I would like to especially welcome Natasha Gajic, who is replacing Kim O'Hart while she is on Long Service Leave. We also welcome back Silvio Lombardi, Mike O'Donohoe and John Angove from Long Service Leave.

We also welcome the following student teachers who will be completing their practicum's at the College this term: Melissa Coelho, Sarah Fogliani and Michael Rathman. We hope that their teaching experiences at the College are rewarding and enriching.

ST MARY'S CATHEDRAL RESTORATION APPEAL

Earlier this year all parents should have received, via your son or daughter, an information package and DVD from Archbishop Hickey regarding the restoration and completion of St Mary's Cathedral in Perth. As the mother church of the Archdiocese, the Archbishop has decided that the time has now come to complete and restore our Cathedral.

As part of fundraising for this \$25 million project, all Catholic schools have been levied the equivalent of \$20 per family for the next three years. La Salle's contribution in 2007 is approximately \$17,000 which has already been forwarded to the Archdiocese.

Our College Board has resolved that in order to help offset to the cost of this levy, we will provide each of our families the opportunity to contribute to the cost of this levy. This contribution is voluntary. Of course, the more that we receive directly in contributions from parents, the fewer funds will need to be withdrawn from the College's reserves. If you wish to make the \$20 voluntary contribution, simply pay the total figure on your Semester II Account. If you do not wish to contribute, then deduct the \$20 from the total amount from your fee statement. There will be no follow up from the College regarding this contribution. Of course, if you have already paid this contribution to your child's Catholic primary school, you may also wish to ignore this voluntary contribution.

As each \$20 collected is returned to the College's reserves as an offset to the levy paid to the Archdiocese, the contribution is not tax deductible.

I would be very happy to discuss this with parents should further information be required.

Students leaving before 8:00pm must be picked up from the Library by a parent. THE BISHOPS RELIGIOUS EDUCATION TEST AND MSE9 TESTING

All parents of current Year 9 students are reminded of the state-wide testing taking place in Weeks 2 - 4 of this term. All Year 9s attended a Year Assembly this week and were given a handout identifying requirements for the testing period. The dates and requirements for the tests are as follows.

Friday, 3 August	Religious Education Test. Students are to supply a black pen ONLY. No other writing implement is permitted.
Monday, 6 August	English MSE9 Test. Students are to supply a ruler, eraser and sharpener. The College will provide a pencil.
Tuesday, 7 August	Maths MSE9 Test. Students are to supply a ruler, eraser, sharpener and calculator. The College will provide a pencil.
Thursday, 9 August	Science MSE9 Test. Students are to supply a ruler, eraser and sharpener. The College will provide a pencil.

ALL Year 9 students are required to complete these tests. Where possible, we ask parents to refrain from organising appointments during the testing period. FR ROMAN'S SPIRITUAL GUIDANCE

The Theology of the Body and Family - Christian and Philosophical View on Human Sexuality. Continued from Delagram 20

MARRIAGE: SACRAMENT OF CHRIST & THE CHURCH

The marriage of Christians is a sacrament by virtue of the spouses baptisms. In other words, marriage is a living sign that truly communicates the love of Christ and the Church. The spouses' vows lived out in their daily commitment, and most specifically in their "one flesh" union, constitute this living sign. As St. Paul says, "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." This is a great mystery, and I mean in reference to Christ and the church" (Eph 5:31-32).

Since the "one flesh" union of man and wife foreshadowed Christ and the Church right from "the beginning," John Paul II speaks of marriage as the primordial sacrament. "All the sacraments of the new covenant find in a certain sense their prototype in marriage," says the Holy Father. This is why Baptism is a "nuptial bath" and why the Eucharist is "the Sacrament of the Bridegroom and of the Bride." When we receive the body of Christ into our own, in a mysterious way, like a bride, we conceive new life in us - life in the Holy Spirit. It is this same Holy Spirit that forms the bond that unites spouses in the Sacrament of Marriage.

This is the "profound mystery" in which marriage participates. The Eucharist, then, is the very source of Christian Marriage. "In the Eucharistic gift of charity the Christian family finds the foundation and soul of its 'communion' and its 'mission,'" that is, to love as God loves.

YEAR12 T.E.E REVISION SEMINARS AT LA SALLE COLLEGE

Dear students and parents

Please be informed of a number of opportunities for students to access TEE revision seminars here at La Salle College in Term 3.

TEE revision seminars are to be conducted over a number of weekends of Term 3. The subjects for which these seminars will be offered are: Accounting, Applicable Mathematics, Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Discrete Mathematics, Economics, English, Geography, History, Human Biology and Physics.
