





Here are some tips when searching for images on the Web.

**File formats:**

Web browsers display images in three file formats: JPEG or JPG (Joint Photographic Experts Group) format, GIF (Graphics Interchange Format) and the PNG (Portable Network Graphics) format.

**Image size/quality:**

It is usual that images you source on the Web are small in file size so they load quickly, but still look good on your monitor. The screen resolution- pixels per inch (ppi) - for MAC monitors is 72 ppi or 96 ppi for a PC monitor. Watch out when printing images with a low file size - they can be very pixellated (large, blocky pixels that distort an image).

**Capturing and saving:**

Hold your cursor over the image, click the right mouse button, from the pop-up menu choose 'Save Picture As' and select the folder you want to save the image to, rename if you wish but don't change the file extension e.g. .jpg, .gif or .png.

**Searching for images:**

As you view images it will usually have an ALT tag - an alternative text caption - which pops up as you mouse over the image. This helps you to identify the image. Alternatively, try searching for images using the following links:



It has been a super busy term for the La Salle Reading Club, Insert Book Here. This term saw the addition of new Year 8 students who were nominated for the club by their English teachers.

The very first meeting of this term was a special event, as it was the launch of the MS Read-a-thon at La Salle College. We were lucky enough to be visited by Ros Edmunds from the MS Foundation who led us through an interactive presentation involving presents, bubble-wrapped goggles and bookmarks during our first lunch time meeting.

The Reading Club students were also invited to attend the official MS Read-a-thon 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary launch, which was held at the Alexander Library in Perth. The students had an exciting day travelling by train to the venue, meeting Bosko, Narelda Jacobs and other prominent MPs and purchasing second hand books from the library book store.

Ten students and myself have registered for the MS Read-a-thon Challenge so far, which aims to raise funds to support people living with Multiple Sclerosis. The students are challenged to read as much as they can for any 30 day period during June, July or August. If you are interested, it's not too late to register! As if that is not enough, the students also entered the Write-A-Book-In-A-Day competition. The competition, hosted by the Katherine Susannah Prichard Foundation, raises funds for Princess Margaret Hospital. People across the country compete in the competition in three categories, Primary, Secondary and Adult. The Secondary section requires students to create a 4000 word text with two allocated human characters, one non-human character, a specified setting and five included words. The students are required to plan, draft, edit, print, illustrate and publish a book in twelve hours. A momentous task!

The students were supported greatly by Ms Flinn who proposed and advocated the competition, Ms Purcell, Mr Connor and the library staff who gave up their time and resources to assist the students on the day, Ms Kadmos for her invaluable advice and Mr Bull for his support in this endeavour. We wait with bated breath for our results.



### ITALIAN EVENTS COMING UP...

I would like to inform parents of some Italian events coming up in Term 3 which are compulsory for students to attend as part of the Italian programme and request if possible, that appointments not be organised on these days.

On Wednesday 29 July (Week 2) in Periods 3 and 4, all Years 8, 9 and 10 Italian students will be viewing an interactive theatre show, *Mattopancetta Commedia dell'Arte*, performed by Cultural Infusion from Melbourne. Students will complete a formal Viewing Task (Outcome 2) after the performance. Your child will be given a letter this week to bring home with further details.

In Week 3, all students studying Italian in Years 9 and 10 will be involved in the Assessment of Language Competence (ALC) Certificate Programme. This offers the students recognition for their achievement in studying languages. The language skills testing programme allows students to respond to realistic Italian texts and situations and is designed to enable all students to experience success. It is prepared, scored, analysed and reported on by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER). All students will receive a Certificate of their achievement, describing the skills demonstrated. La Salle College will also receive a school report which includes an itemised account of each student's performance and summary data of the school's level of achievement, as measured against achievement levels of all participating schools around Australia in each language and level.

Year 9 Italian students will sit a Listening task for the Certificate 1 in Italian on Thursday 6 August during Period 1.

Year 10 Italian students will sit a Listening and Reading task for the Certificate 2 in Italian on Friday 7 August during Periods 1 and 2.

All materials required for the tasks will be supplied and the registration fees have been paid by the LOTE Department.

### WAYANG KULIT EXCURSION QUOTES:

La Salle Indonesian students attended a wayang kulit (traditional Indonesian puppet) performance and here are some of their thoughts on the performance:

Pak Sumardi is an Indonesian puppet master (dalang). He specialises in shadow puppets (wayang kulit). We went and saw one for one his amazing performances at Chisholm College. He was extremely talented but quite hard to understand at times because he spoke mainly in Indonesian but I still managed to understand the story presented. I liked watching from behind and seeing the intricate designs and beautiful colours and the jerky movements that Pak Sumardi made with the puppets. He said that in Indonesia he would perform for up to nine hours at a time without a break. During the show we saw Pak perform all the characters, sound effects, music and speaking himself but usually there would be three or four dalang. The wayang stories are based on two ancient Indian stories the Ramayana and Mahabharata. No one knows where Wayang Kulit originated but I really enjoyed the unforgettable experience. **Grace Murphy**



## LA SALLE FOOTBALL CLUB


