
VISIT BY BR MARK McKEON

YEAR 12 MOCK EXAMS - Monday 5 October to Thursday 15 October 2009

A copy of the Year 12 Mock Exam Timetable is located on our website www.lasalle.wa.edu.au under News & Events. All Year 12 students have been issued with a personalised timetable for the upcoming exams.

Students should be working hard preparing for their examinations. It is a most stressful time, but good preparation does reduce examination anxieties.

The following resources may be useful:

- Subject/Course syllabus ensure that all aspects of the subject/course are studied.
- Past examination papers provide guidance on the style/type of questions.
- A comprehensive set of study notes that are developed and refined to become the main source of information when revising.

While students can wear neat casual dress during the holiday period (5 October to 9 October), the College uniform must be worn to exams from 12 October.

I wish students success with these exams and hope their efforts are rewarded by achieving the best result possible.

UNIVERSITY-TAFE (2010)

Students in Year 12 have recently received handbooks from Notre Dame University and the Tertiary Institutions Service Centre (TISC - which acts on behalf of the public universities) outlining procedures for selecting courses for 2010. The TISC application is completed on the internet and an application form is attached to the Notre Dame handbook. Students should keep in mind that the closing date for these applications is Wednesday 30 September 2009.

TAFE applications open on Friday 4 September 2009. Information regarding the application process will be issued to students soon.

Parents and students who require assistance or further clarification on this matter are asked to contact Ms Huggins, Mr Sackett or myself.

TEE/WACE EXAMS

The TEE/WACE (written papers) begins on Monday 2 November and concludes with the Computer Science 3AB exam on Thursday 19 November.

Students studying Dance 3AB, Drama 2AB or 3AB, Music and Physical Education Studies 2AB or 3AB also have a practical component to the TEE/WACE. These begin on Saturday 26 September. A copy of the TEE/WACE exams can be found at:

Recently my wife, Marian, and myself received an invitation to the 'La Salle Music Soiree'. Now let me explain we are not a musical family. My mother-in-law is a retired opera singer and all our children have been offered free lessons in singing, piano and even guitar. Unfortunately they share their parent's lack of hard work in this area. We have visited the Perth Concert Hall in the past and listened to the WA Orchestra from the choir chairs which has been most enjoyable but our exposure to 'good music' has been limited.

We were honoured to accept the invitation and were pleasantly surprised by what we witnessed on Friday 7 August in the St John Baptist Chapel. After a warm welcome we sat and listened to an excellent piano presentation from Michelle Welschbillig who during her hectic Year 12 schedule has had the time to master some difficult pieces. Jessica Del Borrello also played the piano brilliantly later in the night. It was wonderful to witness talented pianists being heard in the Chapel. Michelle and Jessica played with confidence and gusto.

Saxophone is not an instrument either of us has heard played solo. Katherine Bennison stood before us with joy showing from within her as she played two pieces. The many years playing in front of varied crowds showed she was very comfortable in front of an audience and the adult band she is intending joining will find an able and willing member.

Guitar is an instrument that I personally would love to play. Anastazija Embresic's strumming of her guitar was welcome music to our ears. Her hands moved quickly and effortlessly and produced some strong music from this difficult instrument. Her 7 years of study showed as she produced two excellent pieces.

His first piece, which we have not heard before, was played with confidence and appeared to be 'just a warm up' to his second piece which was Rachmaninov. I, myself, recognised the music as soon as he started. Kieran attacked the difficult piece with classic piano flare. He became one with the piano and made the Chapel move with his vibrant playing. It was a pleasure to watch and hear ... well done to not only Kieran but all the talented students on that night.

Mr Pepper summed up the night perfectly when he commented that "We see these students walking around the College every day and do not see the hidden talents they possess." Well on that winters night in the Chapel a grateful audience showed our final appreciation to the students for revealing to us their personal talents. Myths


about the Brain

Your Brain Is Grey

Have you given any thought to the colour of your brain? Maybe not, unless you work in the medical field. We have all colours of the rainbow in our bodies in the form of blood, tissue, bone and other fluids. But you may have seen preserved brains sitting in jars in a classroom or on TV. Most of the time, those brains are a uniform white, grey or even yellowish. In actuality, though, the living, pulsing brain currently residing in your skull isn't just a dull, bland grey; it's also white, black and red.

Like many myths about the brain, this one has a grain of truth, because much of the brain is grey. Sometimes the entire brain is referred to as grey matter. Mystery writer Agatha Christie's famous detective Hercule Poirot often spoke of using his "little grey cells." Grey matter exists all throughout the various parts of the brain (as well as in the spinal cord); it consists of different types of cells, such as neurons. However, the brain also contains white matter, which comprises nerve fibres that connect the grey matter.

The black component is called substantia nigra, which is Latin for (you guessed it) "black substance." It's black because of neuromelanin, a specialised type of the same pigment that colours skin and hair, and it's a part of the basal ganglia. Finally, we have red and that's thanks to the many blood vessels in the brain. So why are preserved brains chalky looking and dull instead of spongy and colourful? It's due to the fixatives, such as formaldehyde, that keep the brain preserved.


