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BLESSING AND OPENING OF OUR NEW FACILITIES

This evening Monsignor Kevin Long, Rector of St Charles' Seminary will bless our new facilities the Patricia Rodrigues Centre, the Fr Laurence Murphy (SDS) Senior Learning Centre and the Michael Ciccarelli Lecture Theatre. After the blessing, the Director of Catholic Education, Mr Ron Dullard will officially open the buildings.

The naming of these facilities honours the contribution of three key people in the history of the College. Fr Laurence was a member of the College Board from 1977 to 1984. His involvement in the College typified the many contributions that the various religious orders have made to our school since its foundation in 1954. Apart from the integral role played by the De La Salle Brothers, over the past 56 years a number of other religious orders have supported the education of successive generations of students including the Franciscans, the Sisters of Mercy, the Sisters of St Joseph, the Salvatorians, the Christian Brothers and the Sisters of the Infant Jesus.

The Patricia Rodrigues Centre acknowledges the contributions made by Pat as principal of La Salle from 1992 to 1999. During her tenure as principal, Pat oversaw the physical transformation of the College. Her passion for building and fine eye for detail resulted in the College's facilities becoming second to none. Her commitment to the Lasallian heritage saw La Salle strengthen its close ties with the De La Salle Brothers. Pat's legacy after 8 years as principal was the creation of a first class learning environment for her students.

Michael Ciccarelli served the College for over a decade as both Deputy Principal and Principal. His time as principal was characterised by the further development of the College's pastoral care system and the consolidation of the work of his predecessor, Patricia Rodrigues. Michael worked hard at building relationships and "touching hearts".

I would like to thank Michael Pepper, Sabrina Lynsdale, all staff, members of the Student Representative Council and all student performers for their great work in ensuring that this evening's ceremony will be a great celebration for the College.

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FROM THE CATHOLIC EDUCATION OFFICE

GOVERNMENTS MUST SUPPORT PARENTAL CHOICE IN EDUCATION

All major political parties in Australia agree on the principle that parents must have the right to select the education of their choosing for their children.

A commitment to government funding for all students, regardless of where they go to school, is firmly entrenched in the Australian way of life and must be retained.

The Catholic education sector believes that this principle should be strongly supported in the 2010 Election. The Federal Education Funding Review must begin its work based on this general principle.

In this way, the Review can deliver a truly fair outcome for all students, whether they attend a government school, an independent school, or a Catholic school.

Students should not be penalised in terms of government funding because their parents choose to send them to a Catholic school which will provide them with a first class education steeped in the Catholic faith and ethos. Importantly, future parents must have the same capacity as current and earlier generations of parents to exercise their freedom of choice in schooling.

FREEDOM OF CHOICE AND FAIR FUNDING IS CRUCIAL FOR CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

Commonwealth and State Government funding arrangements have historically respected the identity, integrity and autonomy of Catholic schools.

The ability of Catholic schools to enhance their curriculum and school life with the Catholic faith and instruct students in the Catholic ethos is fundamental to the mission of Catholic education.

The Federal Government has announced a sweeping review of the nation's system of funding government and non-government schools including Catholic schools.

An essential outcome of the Review and the Federal election must be that funding, compliance and accountability requirements support the autonomy of Catholic schools, while ensuring they receive a fair share of government funding.

Only by guaranteeing indexed funding for Catholic schools can Commonwealth and State Governments actively support and encourage parental freedom of school choice for children.

The major political parties must support this principle in the 2010 Election and we encourage you to ask your local federal election candidates where they stand on guaranteed federal funding and autonomy for Catholic schools.

MAJOR PARTIES MUST GUARANTEE FUNDING SECURITY FOR CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

All political parties must guarantee funding certainty for Catholic education and Catholic schools. Funding certainty means a guarantee of indexed funding for Catholic schools.

The Catholic education system educates one in five Australian children. With over 70 000 teachers, over 700 000 students, and 1 700 schools we require funding certainty set in Commonwealth legislation.

The Federal Government has announced a sweeping review of the nation's system of funding government and non-government schools including Catholic schools.

A key outcome of the funding review must be that Catholic schools and systems have funding certainty from the Commonwealth Government, underpinned by legislation.

Also Catholic schools and systems must be able to continue allocating funds in a flexible, responsive and transparent manner to best meet the educational and personal needs of all students.

To ensure an ability to meet the rising costs of education, funding levels must be indexed annually using a transparent mechanism.

As education costs rise at a rate greater than the Consumer Price Index, indexation must be linked to government school recurrent costs via a cost of schooling price index.

CALLING FOR A GUARANTEE ON INDEXED FUNDING FOR CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

The Federal Government has announced a sweeping review of the nation's system of funding government and non-government schools including Catholic schools.

When all forms of government funding are considered, Catholic school students receive substantially less (only 85 percent) funding per student than government school students.

The NCEC are seeking commitments from the Labor Party and the Coalition to guarantee indexed funding for Catholic schools so that they have funding certainty for the future.

Christopher Pyne from the Coalition has given NCEC written confirmation that under a Coalition Government, all schools would have future funding certainty, and that a Coalition Government would seek to 'enhance' funding arrangements from 2013.

We are meeting with Simon Crean, the Minister for Education, and we will be seeking the same commitment.

The National Catholic Education Commission needs your support, as parents, teachers, students, parishioners, friends and supporters to ensure our schools and students get the funding they deserve.

We encourage you to ask your local Federal Member of Parliament and other candidates where they stand on guaranteed indexed funding for Catholic schools.


INTER-HOUSE DANCE COMPETITION


