

# ALL PARENTS & STUDENTS

## LEARNING DISABILITIES & EXTRA TIME FOR EXAMINATIONS

There has been some confusion as to what constitutes a case for extra time during written examinations for students who have learning difficulties. Based on Curriculum Council policy in order for students to receive extra time during written examinations they must demonstrate that they have a learning disability such as dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyspraxia or a non-specified learning disability. Processing disorders including Central Auditory Processing Disorder do not fall within the category to which extra time can be granted. In order to support students with such processing disorders other measures are put in place within the school context but they are not entitled to extra time during written examinations. In order to stay in line with Curriculum Council Policy, La Salle College will only be granting extra time to those students sitting written exams in Year 10 - 12 who fit the criteria as set out by the Curriculum Council. The Curriculum Council is a "government body that is responsible for the development and accreditation of senior school courses together with the assessment and certification of senior school achievement in Western Australia".

## SHARE THE MISSION - QUEENSLAND



This time last year, I was a Year 12 student stressing over my upcoming TEE exams and frantically trying to get my university and TAFE applications submitted in time. It wasn't until I reached this stressful point in time that I began to consider taking a year off to recuperate before hitting the books again for another four years. I put in an application for the "Share the Mission" Programme, and now twelve months later I'm living in Scarborough, Queensland volunteering at Southern Cross College.

I've been living in Scarborough for over six months now, and the year is flying by. I'm doing the programme with two other girls, who both graduated last year and decided that they needed a gap year.

Our year so far has been very eventful. Only a couple of weeks after we arrived, it was off to retreat with the Year 12s where we met some amazing students. Since then, we have accompanied Year 11s to a Lasallian Youth Gathering in Adelaide, gone on a ten day road trip through outback Queensland with the Year 9s, attended retreat days for Year 9s and 11s and gone to the Year 12 formal.

We have also started some programmes here at the school. We formed a group of Lasallian Student Leaders with some fantastic Year 11 girls, who next year will be running a programme with Year 7 students. On Thursdays at lunch we have a group we call "i49", where students can come if they are having a hard time out in the yard and just play games or listen to music with other kids. Earlier this term, we ran a Vinnies Sleepout for the senior students. We all spent a night homeless-style, eating at a "soup kitchen" and sleeping on hard cardboard boxes, to raise some community awareness.

We three girls spend a lot of time with the De La Salle Brothers community here in Scarborough. These five Brothers are amazing men, who have spent their whole lives working in Lasallian missions. They invite us over to their house for dinner each week, and we have had really fun times- celebrating birthdays, having Christmas in July, learning to play croquet, and finding tasty new flavours of ice-cream.

If you are considering taking a gap year, I recommend Share the Mission. It's a great way to spend the year, and you can make a difference in the lives of many students. ## FOLLOW YOUR DREAMS

A group of twenty Year 10 students attended an inspirational lecture by visiting NASA astronaut, Dr Andy Thomas at the UWA Octagon Theatre last week. Quoting Dr Thomas, "a boy from Adelaide had a dream to become an astronaut." He made his dream a reality, completing four space missions! Dr Thomas communicated to the 700 primary and secondary students attending the lecture the importance of following their dreams.



Dr Thomas graduated from the University of Adelaide with First Class Honours with a bachelor of engineering degree. Completing further studies he received a doctorate in mechanical engineering before moving to America. Dr Thomas commenced his career as a research scientist with the Lockheed Aeronautical Systems Company and later with the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) in California. Successfully applying for a position in the NASA space programme in 1992, Dr Thomas trained as a mission specialist for the Space Shuttle flights.

Dr Thomas delivered a captivating speech to students accompanied by images and personal video footage from all four space missions. His first opportunity to visit space was on board Endeavour in 1996. This was a "ride of a lifetime" - an eight and half minute ride from launch to space! Dr Thomas spent twenty weeks in space on board the Russian Space Station 'Mir' after training as a cosmonaut for one year which included one of his most difficult challenges, learning to speak Russian. He completed the Space Shuttle Discovery mission in 2001 and finally, his most important mission to date, the 'Return to Flight' mission on board Discovery in 2005, two years after the ill-fated Columbia Space Shuttle mission.

Students' highlights from the lecture:

"The videos we viewed gave us a firsthand experience [of being an astronaut]," *Eamon O'Brien* and "what it is like to be launched into space," *Katie Larkins*.

"I particularly liked the video footage ...what the Earth looked like from in the shuttle as it is taking off and space from the astronaut's point of view ...they were fascinating, engaging and allowed us to experience life in space," *Madison Italiano*.

"The inspirational speech from Dr Andy Thomas learning about what happens on each space mission," *Olivia Zaffino*.

"The opportunity given to school-age students to share in some of the knowledge and wisdom of a famous Australian is a great way to inspire and motivate students," *Anthony Bochrinis*.

"The most memorable part for me, even if I don't plan on being an astronaut, [is] that I should achieve my very best and 'shoot for the stars' to gain the best outcome in my life and achieve my dreams," *Brandon Bradburn*.

"The best part of the excursion was getting to meet a real NASA astronaut. Dr Andy Thomas has shown me that I can do whatever I want if I have goals and ambitions," *Jayden Lee*.

Students who attended the lecture would like to take the opportunity to sincerely thank Ms Panebianco for accompanying them and driving the College bus.

**~ Battery Recycling ~**

You may be surprised to know that Western Australia leads the way with household battery recycling. An initiative of the EMRC, The Dry Cell Battery Working Group (<http://www.emrc.org.au/battery-recycling-programs.html>) oversees the battery recycling campaign in Western Australia. With 80 per cent of batteries containing valuable zinc dry cell batteries can be recycled into products such as street lights and car parts. AusBatt Recycling (<http://www.ausbatt.com.au/new.html>), an offshoot of AusZinc, is undertaking the recycling process. AA, AAA, C and D batteries can be dropped off at the battery recycle bins located at the Midland and Guildford libraries, the City of Swan Administration Centre and the Midland Gate Shopping Centre (bin located in the entrance near the Food Court).

### YEAR 10 OUTDOOR EDUCATION EXCURSION




