C.A.S. Hawker Scholarships are the most generous privately funded scholarships available to undergraduate students in Australia. The scholarships are valued at up to \$60 000 over four years. The Charles Hawker Scholarships perpetuates the memory of scholar, soldier, pastoralist and statesman Charles Allan Seymour Hawker and commemorates the achievements of one of Australia's most respected pastoral pioneers.

This year the Trustees awarded seven scholarships to students from three states. Family member and former Speaker of the House of Representatives Hon David Hawker MP presented the students with their scholarships at a function at St Mark's College in Adelaide.

The scholarships are available to **all** Australian students. Since 1991 the majority have been awarded to students entering their first year of university study.

Selection is based on personal qualities as well as academic ability. Undergraduate Hawker Scholars are able to attend a range of Australian educational institutions.

The scholarships are open from Monday 6 December and close on Friday 7 January 2011.

## NIGHT WITH THE NOBLES

The culmination of the Year 7-10 Talented and Gifted Programme is the annual *Night with the Nobles* presentation. Seventy-three students presented items that encapsulated their year's work to guests from the College community. The audience witnessed the depth and breadth of the studies undertaken by these students. The students' performances clearly demonstrated their commitment to excellence.

An enthusiastic group of Year 7s presented short stories, poems and speeches based on their study of biodiversity. The class created a giant jigsaw from their original artwork and assembled the pieces on a banner to highlight the importance of biodiversity and the need for each person to do their part to maintain the variety of species, DNA, genes, habitats and ecosystems. The banner was donated to the College for display in 2011.

Year 8 student presentations were based on their Literature Circle reading groups. The groups shared their reading experience and developed an informed understanding of the topics covered in their respective novels. From their readings students planned, wrote and produced a short play to depict a scene or topic from their novel.

Each Year 9 student selected an eminent person to study, researching the major contributions their person made to society and the impact of this today. Their studies were presented as monologues or bio-riddles. In addition, students presented the winning entry *The 11:00am Project* from their in-depth investigation of tuart woodlands in Semester 2 and the highly commended *Florianian Rhapsody*.

Year 10 students presented an overview of an inspirational lecture by visiting NASA Astronaut, Dr Andy Thomas which they attended in Term 3. Furthermore, these students were outstanding in providing assistance both backstage, in the production box and as Master of Ceremonies on the night.

To conclude the evening, guests viewed displays of the students' work. On behalf of the 2010 Talented and Gifted students, we would like to thank all the people who helped make this event a night to remember.




### GOOD LUCK HANNAH-MARIE DUCROW!


#### **CAMERON MEYER VISIT**
