

Mix it all together with prayer, repentance and love and keep it in the oven for forty days until it is ready to enjoy on Easter Sunday.



FROM THE CHAPLAIN

Fast means to cut down the amount of food we eat, maybe one or two meals a day like in some of the poor countries. Abstinence is simply giving up or going without some of the things for some time e.g. alcohol, cigarettes for adults and for youth it means - ice-cream, chocolates, meat on Fridays etc. Money saved that way can then be donated to Caritas, Project Compassion, St Vincent de Paul or other charitable organisations to help others who are less fortunate in our world. Fast and abstinence makes us stronger in character and helps us to endure suffering.

Almsgiving and works of charity are very important ingredients of growing in love of God and others. It is the commandment of Love in practice. Think of the ways you can help others during this Lent.


Prayer is the time we spend with God. Lent gives us lots of opportunities to pray: weekend Mass, Stations of the Cross, Lenten Programme, private meditation of the Passion of Jesus, the Divine Mercy Chaplet etc. All of these can be achieved if we make up our mind to cut down on some of our social activities, restricting watching TV etc. We might even be surprised how much spare time we have on our hands to pray and be with God. Check your local parish for some of these prayer times. Join the group and grow in knowing, loving and serving Jesus.

I ask you to do it happily, joyfully and willingly. Remember our heavenly Father loves joyful giving and rewards the good effort of those who serve him whole heartedly.

Hope you will enjoy the cooking and the beautiful season of Lent.



SWIM-A-THON

The College Swim-A-Thon is drawing near and will take place in Week 6 of this term in the College Pool. It will now be held on Wednesday 10 March. The event will raise money for the Lasallian Foundation which supports underprivileged children and communities in many third world countries.

Sponsorship forms and envelopes have been distributed to students within their PCG. They are now being encouraged to seek out sponsors to raise money for the event. Sponsors have a choice of making a donation or pledge towards each lap that students are able to swim within a House. (For example if 1 cent per lap is pledged and the students within a House swim 1000 laps, then \$10 would be collected). After the event, all sponsorship forms must be returned to the College whether students have been able to collect sponsors or not.

All students have been invited to participate in a House team within their year level. If your child has not put their name down to swim some laps in the event, please encourage them to speak to their House Coordinator who is organising the teams. The following are the times that each year level will be allocated:

- Period 1 Year 7
- Period 2 Year 8
- Period 3 Year 9
- Period 4 Year 11
- Period 5 Year 12
- Period 6 Year 10

During this time House teams will endeavour to swim as many laps as possible, whilst students that have chosen not to swim will watch and cheer on students within their house. Students who do participate in the event are allowed to wear their House uniform for the day.

Parents are welcome to come and watch their child participate in the event and there will be a barbecue and various cold drinks sold at lunchtime to add to the spirit of the day.

At the end of the day a short assembly will be held to announce how many laps each House was able to swim. Students will then collect the money they have raised and return this to the College. Donations and pledges can be collected before the event or up to a week after the event.

There will be prizes awarded to the House that swims the most laps along with the House that raises the most money. Students who raise over \$20 will have their names be also placed into a raffle within their House to be in the running for a \$50 voucher.

Please encourage your child to collect sponsors in order to support their House and the Lasallian Foundation. If you have any questions about the event please feel free to contact me at the College.


