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EASTER CELEBRATIONS

ONSITE

A reminder to all students and parents of ONSITE participants that the La Salle College WPL/ONSITE School Policy returns are now very, very overdue. The back page of the policy contains a "Declaration" page that was due for return over a month ago. Students or parents who have misplaced their policy can access "MyClasses" from the College website at home to download another copy. The Policy contains important information about the WPL course and the ONSITE programme. Any queries or concerns should be directed to your child's WPL teacher.

A reminder also that all ONSITE students should be at the workplace on their normal day (mostly a Tuesday) in both weeks of the holidays. Students should negotiate with employers if this needs to change and ONSITE should be contacted as well to be advised of any changes. It is not acceptable to simply not go at all as there is a minimum requirement of the number of hours a student must complete in the workplace in order to be able to receive a grade for the WPL course. Students are, in fact, strongly encouraged to try and organise additional days of work during the school holiday period to ensure they have covered the necessary hours and to further their workplace experience. YEAR 9 TUTORIAL

Please can parents of Year 9 children assist them with completing the form appropriately and returning them to their Tutorial teacher as soon as they can. Forms should NOT be sent directly to the ATO; they must be submitted to the College as we complete paperwork to accompany the forms. Parents who do not wish for their child to apply for a Tax File Number are asked to advise the Tutorial teacher in writing so we are not chasing the child unnecessarily. Questions or concerns should be directed to your child's Tutorial teacher.

YEAR 10 POLITICS & LAW EXCURSION

On Thursday 25 February, the Year 10 Politics and Law class, which is the first of its kind at La Salle College, ventured to the Perth Supreme Courts. The day was one that was both educational and entertaining.

We began with a meeting near the Francis Burt Educational Centre; where we were introduced to Mr Dean Curtis. Mr Curtis explained the basic policies and procedures of the courts, such as the metal detectors near the entrance of the court, which sounded when I walked through due to my badges, and the standard requirement of total silence whilst in the court rooms.

Once he had explained these policies and procedures to the class in quite some depth, we ventured into the Supreme Courts and were taken into an empty court room where the various positions of the court were explained; the in depth explanation of the positions within a court room was highly beneficial.

The class viewed the application of laws outlined in the Constitution in action! Generally speaking, we saw a court case in action! The case that was in session, involved a man who was believed to have 'intent' to sell and supply drugs. This insight into the action of legal procedures in Australia, allowed the class to have an understanding of how real procedures were conducted. The court case also allowed many students to understand the reality of the legal system, and to allow them to understand that the television portrayal was completely inaccurate and American based. The class was also amazed at the skill of the prosecution barrister, who was sure to win his case against the accused; due to his superior control of tone and strong sense of passion.

After we had spent around 30 minutes in the case, we were then taken to one of the original court rooms within Perth; where we re-enacted the sentencing of a fifteen year old boy accused of murdering his step brother. The positions included two judges, played by myself and Yolanda Dudley, four barristers, played by Simone Cooper, Anthony Bochrinis, Matthew Bond and Jayden Lee, and also the accused, played by Nathan O'Kane. This re-enactment gave the class an even better insight to Australian legal systems during earlier times, and provided the class with some excellent memories.



Once we had finished our day at the courts, the class made its way down to a beautiful restaurant overlooking the ocean, suggested by Ms Raja. The day was truly memorable and, once again, on behalf of the class I would like to thank Ms Raja for organising the venture, Mr White for driving us to the courts and finally, Ms Keenan for allowing the event to take place. In conclusion, the class had an excellent time and we are truly grateful for this wonderful opportunity that had given to us and we look forward to the prosperous year ahead!

LET'S DO THE TWIST

Year 8 students have been working very hard in Science to create and test 'twisters', more commonly known as paper helicopters. The process involved looking at a model of a twister and then generating their own design to test to see what variables affect flight. Students busily formulated a method in groups and then had the fun task of conducting their experiment.

The second storey balcony around the B and G block provided the perfect platform for the students to carry out the tests. Most of the helicopters spun gracefully to the ground, with some newer models made of different materials plummeting towards the earth! Gusts of wind also influenced some flights, with some helicopters appearing to fly back up and others coming dangerously close to rooftops and gutters.

So what did the students find out?

"As we predicted, the helicopter made of card travelled the fastest (to the ground) and the helicopter made of butchers paper hovered the longest giving it the highest result... The card helicopter didn't spin as rapidly as others and pretty much went straight down". Caitlyn Hammond

"Each time we tested the helicopter we found that the more paper clips added, the quicker the fall. It was very hard to throw (the twister back) up a 5m tall balcony." Niamh Whitford

"Even if you think you get all your variables right, you should always think about the variables you cannot change, such as the wind!"- Jack Greig

"The experiment was fun and it taught (me) that the heavier something is the faster it will fall" Lorenzo Italiano

College Student Notebooks


