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SCHOOL FUNDING REVIEW

The Australian Government is undertaking a School Funding Review of schools for school funding post 2012. There is also a Federal Election to be held later this year.

The Catholic Bishops of Australia are seeking to obtain from both the Government and the Opposition the provision of ongoing funding for Catholic schools at least the same level in real terms.

To assist with the campaign, the Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia would like to provide information regarding Catholic education for parents and friends of Catholic students to discuss with local candidates regarding their stance on future Catholic education funding and for parents and friends to be in a position to make an informed decision come closer to the election.

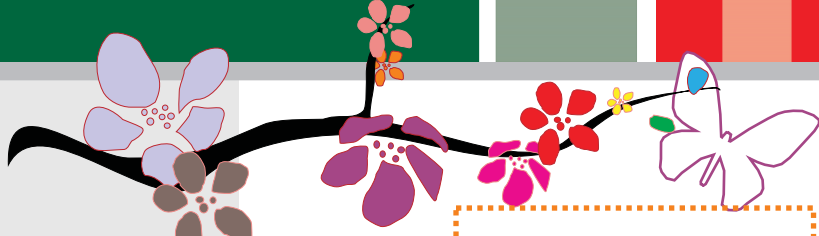

INTERNET & PHONE SAFETY

Here are some tips for students on how to use your phone and the internet safely.

Internet

- **THINK** before you post! Would you want your teacher or parent or employer to see what you have just written?
- **6 DEGREES OF SEPARATION:** A friend of a friend of a friend... Anyone can get access to your page this way. Chances are you are not even aware of the spider web of connections between your friends, their acquaintances, school mates, teachers, parents and more. Someone-who knows someone-who knows someone can read your comments and view your images without you knowing.
- **ONLY** put information up on the net that you are comfortable sharing with people all over the world. E.g. refrain from putting up mobile numbers, address etc. Addresses can be tracked via your email (via the IP address).
- **MAKE SURE** your computer's spyware/virus software is up to date.
- **THINK** about your electronic foot print. What will come up about you when a potential employer 'Google's' your name?
- **WHO ARE YOU? ARE YOU WHO YOU SAY YOU ARE?** Anyone can say that they are a 14 year old girl/ boy in a chat room. Anyone can fake a Facebook page. Who are you really talking to?
- **AVOID chatting with people who make sexual references.** If someone is using sexual language or references it is best to stop contact with them. Research into paedophiles has shown that stalkers use the net as a place to attract young people and they often start by talking sexually (grooming) before asking to meet the young person face-to-face. If the person keeps contacting you, contact the police.
- **TALK** to your parents, teachers, school counsellor or an adult who can act and will help you if you are feeling unsafe about anything that has happened on the net.

Mobiles

- **THINK ABOUT THE CONSEQUENCES** of taking, sending, or forwarding a sexual picture of someone under the age of 18, even if it's of you. You could face humiliation, get kicked off teams, lose your job, and even get in trouble with the law.
- **NEVER TAKE** images of yourself that you wouldn't want everyone (your classmates, your teachers, your family, or your employers) to see.
- **BEFORE HITTING SEND**, remember that you can't control where this image may travel. What you send to a boyfriend or girlfriend could easily end up with their friends, and their friends, and their friends...
- **IF YOU FORWARD** a sexual picture of someone underage, you are as responsible for this image as the original sender. You could face child pornography charges, go to jail, and have to register as a sex offender.
- **REPORT** any nude pictures you receive on your cell phone to an adult you trust. Do not delete the message. Instead, get your parents or guardians, teachers, and school counsellors involved immediately.

~ **NETS Search** ~ Countless hours can be wasted when searching the Internet for information. Ways to improve your search results, and reduce the time you spend online, is to “start narrow, use exact phrases, trim the URL, and seek similar pages”. The “NETS” method - narrow, exact, trim and seek - was developed by Dr. Bernie Dodge, the co-developer of the WebQuest concept (see <http://webquest.sdsu.edu/searching/fournets.htm>). The NETS method can improve your online search techniques.

Start narrow and use keywords e.g. brainstorm the topic before you go online, develop a list of keywords to narrow your search, or define a word e.g. definition: oil spill. *Tip:* search for a word or phrase in a web page by using the keyboard shortcut CTRL + F.

Use exact phrases - use the search engine's **Advanced Search** feature and type in the exact words or phrase you want to search, or use quotation marks in the search field when searching e.g. “bp gulf oil spill map”.

Trim the URL - the Uniform Resource Locator or the 'address' of a web page on the World Wide Web by stepping backwards and removing part of the URL. You may find other pages that are interesting. *Tip:* use the country code in your search e.g. “oil spill map site:.au” will search for maps relating to oil spills in or around Australia.

Seek similar pages - in **Advanced Search** click on the plus sign + **Date, usage rights, numeric range, and more** at the bottom of the dialogue box to expand the Advanced Search options. Use the **Page-specific tools** to find pages similar to the page, or to find pages that link to the page.

~ **Save the Links** ~ You found a good website and want to revisit it at a later date - how do you save the link? Save the URL by using the keyboard shortcut CTRL + D and **Add to Favorites**. You can create a folder for each topic e.g. click on **Create Folder** name the folder and **Create** e.g. create a folder for news links, or a folder for environment links. Click on the **Add** button to add the link.

You can save your favourite links to your hard drive. You may want to use them on a different computer, or if you are upgrading to a new computer import them so you don't have to start from scratch. In Internet Explorer select **File > Import and Export** and follow the instructions in the 'Import and Export' wizard to export and save, or import and re-establish, your favourite links.
