## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

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Welcome to our 2011 academic year. A special welcome to our new students and staff. The beginning of a new year brings about great excitement. For our students and staff it is a very busy time, however, with good preparation and focused efforts, we are assured of a smooth transition into College life. I particularly would like to thank all of our staff for their professionalism and dedication in ensuring your children have begun their academic year well.

We began last week participating in the Opening Mass where Fr Leonard (sds) our College Chaplain reminded us about committing ourselves wholeheartedly to our work and taking courage in all that we do. As a College community we also prayed for our fellow Australians who were devastated by floods and fire. I have no doubt that the generosity of our Lasallian community will come to the fore as our Student Representative Council begins its fundraising plan for 2011. A key focus will be supporting our fellow Australians in this time of tragedy.

Fr Leonard also commissioned our College Board in their leadership role for 2011. Under the leadership of Mrs Anne Lockyer, Chair of the Board, the new board members were presented with a candle symbolising the light of Christ. Following on from the Opening Mass saw the students gather for the College assembly. Mr Ron Dullard, Director of Catholic Education, presented our 2010 Year 12 students who achieved an ATAR score of 90+ with some key remarks regarding their successful final year of schooling. In congratulating the College on its outstanding achievements in 2010, he acknowledged the efforts of our students, staff and parents in their magnificent effort of achieving 100% graduation. Mr Randazzo, Vice Principal has presented an overview of these results in this edition of the Delagram. The College community was also introduced to our student leaders. Under the leadership of Bridgett Hodgkin, Bob Billing, Kimberley Burton and Jachike Ikealumba, the Student Representative Council will provide strong and vibrant student leadership this year.

This week we commenced our year level information evenings for parents/guardians. Underpinning the key message of these meetings is the need for strong partnerships between home and school. Parents/guardians, as the prime educators of your children in faith and life, we seek to support you in your endeavours by providing a quality Catholic education. The College requires you to ensure that the College enrolment agreement is fully supported and enacted. Your support in ensuring students attend to their part of the agreement will guarantee that they will have an outstanding education - one where their gifts and talents are nurtured, drawn out and flourish.

During this past week, the College staff celebrated the Commissioning Mass for Catholic school staff at St Mary's Cathedral. La Salle College is one of 158 Catholic schools in Western Australia educating some 72 000 children. With an 8 500 work force, celebrating as a Eucharistic community throughout the State, it is a powerful statement of unity that is Christ focused. Coming together in prayer and celebration provides all Catholic school staff with a clear message of our evangelising purpose. The Mass also welcomed new staff to Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Perth.

Finally, our theme for 2011 is of *elevating our sights*. As a College, we need to continually focus on the God given potential of each student - enabling them to realise their gifts and talents. Fr Leonard's homily reminded our students of the need to commit wholeheartedly to their studies and College life and to be courageous in their endeavours. This Sunday's Gospel reading was drawn from the Gospel of St Matthew (5: 14-16). In teaching the disciples, Jesus reminds them to be the "light of the world... let your light shine before others; so that they may see your good works and give glory to God in heaven". This Gospel imperative resonates closely with this Lasallian theme of *elevating our sights*. If we are utilising our God given talents and gifts then we will shine not only to those around us, but to the broader community. We become beacons of hope. Let us all make this our focused theme for 2011.

May 2011 bring to you all a rewarding year - one that is uplifting, challenging, satisfying and enjoyable. 'Deo duce' - with God as our leader we can expect His rich blessings.

### 2010 YEAR 12 WACE RESULTS

High achievers from the Year 12 2010 student cohort were invited to the first College assembly, last week, to be acknowledged and congratulated for their hard work and commitment to excellence.

Mr Ron Dullard, Director of Catholic Education in WA, was in attendance to personally congratulate the students and thank the staff for providing opportunities for students to achieve at a high level.

Some key results from 2010 Year 12 students:

- 100% Graduation
- 8 Certificates of Excellence (students who achieve at least 18 'A' grades over Year 11 and 12).
- Ranked 47 from first 50 Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) Stage 3 examination (65+) schools.



## STUDENT RECOGNITION SYSTEM 2011

# STUDENT ATTENDANCE

With regard to student attendance, all private schools complete a Commonwealth and State Census twice yearly. To comply with this process all schools must be able to show that they have very accurate attendance statistics. With the high profile court case recently in Perth where a school overstated its enrolment, the Federal and State Governments are implementing an audit process. As a result, I need to bring some matters to your attention.

For your child to be considered as in "regular attendance", the School Education Act 1999 requires that your child attends for at least 90% of the time the school is operating. The Act does not consider unexplained absences of 10% in a term to be regular attendance; that is, 5 or more days unexplained absence per term. The term "unexplained" means that the child was not sick, attending an appointment or due to unforeseen circumstances, unable to come to school. No explanation was provided in writing to say where the child was on that day. The school then has the task of asking the parent or guardian for a written explanation. If we don't receive one, technically, we can't claim the child's enrolment and the authorities should be notified.

It is on the census data that the authorities base their audit. All of our absentee records will be examined and we may even have to provide the notes you write to explain the absence. Therefore, I am asking all parents and guardians to work with us on this very important matter and provide a note for every absence as soon after the child comes back to school. This can be given directly to your child's Pastoral Care Advisor. **Please telephone the school if your child is going to be away (the Absentee line is 9449 0682), however, a follow up note is needed as a legal requirement.** Emails are not satisfactory because you cannot sign them. They are, however, an efficient way of letting us know where your child is that day. For your convenience, the Student Organiser has a tear-off Absent note section at the back (orange pages). The College is currently working on setting up an SMS notification system to parents/guardians if their child is away and the school has not been contacted.

If you receive a phone call or letter from your child's Pastoral Care Advisor, House Coordinator or Assistant Principal asking for a note explaining an absence, please understand that we are following our legal responsibility. The terms "reasonable" and "acceptable" are used to describe an explanation for an absence. Where this description has been met everyone is covered. **Unacceptable absences** are described as "undertaking leisure/recreational activities during school hours (i.e. shopping, camping, visiting friends), or participating in a non-educational holiday or a holiday, the duration of which will be more than one whole school term."

I know that most of our families' do an excellent job in providing us with written notes about absences. However, in particular for new families to the College, I needed to bring this matter to everyone's attention. If you receive a phone call or letter from the school you know the reason behind it.

Please feel free to contact me at the College if you have any concerns or issues.

Finally, I would like to congratulate the following students who had an attendance rate of 100% last year. The College acknowledged these students at our final assembly in 2010. We look forward to recognising more students this year.

### PARENT-TEEN CONNECTION WORKSHOP (RELATIONSHIPS AUSTRALIA)

Parent - Teen Connection workshop for parents of teenagers, aims to provide practical skills and suggestions to deal with problems and situations such as moodiness, money, clothes, leaving home, sexuality, stealing, drinking and drugs. ## SWIM-A-THON

The Swim-A-Thon will be a fun event held in the Matthew Kennedy Aquatic Centre (College pool) on Thursday 17 March. It will raise money for the Lasallian Foundation which supports underprivileged children and communities in many third world countries. The Lasallian Foundation is currently undertaking missions in India, Sri Lanka, Papua New Guinea, Pakistan, Thailand and Myanmar. Money raised from the Swim-A-Thon will be added to the profits of Mission Aid Day and this year the College is hoping to raise enough money to support a worthy cause in one of these countries as well as providing support for flood and fire victims in Australia.

Students will be invited to participate in the Swim-A-Thon in House teams within their year level. Each year level will be allocated a period throughout the day during which time their team will endeavour to swim as many laps as possible for their House. Students who choose not to swim will cheer on students from their House as they watch their year level swim in the designated period.

Parents will be welcome throughout the day and there will be a barbecue and various cold drinks sold at lunch to add to the spirit of the day.

In order to raise money for the Lasallian Foundation, students are being asked to collect sponsors for the event. Each student will be provided with a sponsorship form and envelope in which they will collect any money they raise. These will be distributed to students during PCG next Tuesday. Sponsors have a choice of making a donation or pledge towards each lap that students are able to swim within a House. (For example if 1 cent per lap is pledged and the students within a House swim 1000 laps, then \$10 would be collected).


At the end of the day an announcement will be made as to how many laps each House was able to swim. Students will then collect the money they have raised and return these to the College. Donations and pledges can be collected before the event or up to a week after the event. We are asking that all students return their sponsorship form in the envelope provided regardless of whether they are able to find sponsorship. All forms will be accounted for.

There will be prizes awarded to the House that swims the most laps along with the House that raises the most money. Names of students who raise over \$20 will be placed into a raffle within their House to be in the running for an I-Pad.

More information about the running of the day will be available in the next Delagram. Please encourage your child to collect sponsors in order to support their House and the Lasallian Foundation. We look forward to this event.

## SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION


According to the policy of the Archdiocese of Perth, Sacraments of Initiation should be received and celebrated within the local parish community.


### **LA SALLE JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB**
