This week Aboriginal Education Coordinator, Mr Calleja, Year 12 students Synarah Murphy, Lisa Pitt and Zanamarica Bodey and I attended the launch of the BHP Billiton and Australian Indigenous Education Foundation Aboriginal students scholarship breakfast. This important corporate sponsorship programme assists Aboriginal students from the Pilbara region with access to boarding schools, thus enabling the students to have more diverse educational opportunities. Zanamarica and Synarah both spoke well at the breakfast launch, highlighting their support from home and school in enabling them to further their educational pursuits. As a College, we are very grateful for the sponsorship programme. The Australian Government's 'Closing the Gap' is a commitment by all Australian governments to improve the lives of Indigenous Australians, and in particular provide a better future for indigenous children. Sponsorship such as this assists greatly in providing opportunities for young Aboriginal students. La Salle College with its close links to both the Kimberley and Pilbara regions is certainly supporting this important objective of the Australian government.

Last weekend, La Salle College hosted 30 World Youth Day pilgrims returning home from Spain to the Broome Diocese. Mr Pepper, supported by Mrs Pepper picked up the weary travelers from the Perth International Airport at midnight and brought them back to La Salle College for a short break. Accompanying the pilgrims was Bishop Christopher Saunders, Bishop of Broome and Fr Matthew Digges, Director of Vocations, Broome Diocese. Bishop Saunders was grateful for the hospitality given by the College and in particular, by Mr and Mrs Pepper. After a most successful World Youth Day in Madrid, Spain, the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI announced that the next international gathering for youth will occur in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil on July 8 - 13, 2013.

I was delighted to receive a letter from His Grace, Barry Hickey, Archbishop of Perth informing the College that it was joint recipient of the Archbishop's Spirit Award. This award recognises the commitment the College has made to LifeLink in both fund raising for Catholic social services agencies and supporting the web link with both the Archbishop and Bishop Don Sproston, Auxiliary Bishop of Perth. Well done to the Lasallian community for their wonderful sense of service. The College strongly promotes the Lasallian message of 'serving the least, last and lost' very well.

Finally, I received an email from Mary-Anne Reid, Electorate Officer for Mr Ken Wyatt, MP and Member for Hasluck thanking students and staff who supported the cleaning up of Blackadder Creek and the surrounding areas. These students were participating in the Touching Hearts Christian Service-Learning Programme and were supported by Mr Mark Ielasi, Coordinator of the programme. Ms Reid thanked the College for the support, and acknowledged the enthusiasm and commitment of the students. Well done to these students and to Mr Ielasi for their support to this important community service event.


A REMINDER ABOUT STUDENT ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL



YEARS 7-12 ITALIAN COMMEDIA DELL'ARTE PERFORMANCE

Dear Parent/Guardian

As part of the Italian programme for 2011, Commedia Academy of WA will present one of their interactive theatre shows of the Commedia dell'Arte, 'Capitano Spacca Zucchini', to the Years 7, 8, 10 and 12 Italian classes. Students will meet the characters of the Commedia dell'Arte and learn the historical background and social context of early theatre, as they watch the humorous show which will be bi-lingual.

To aid the students in their understanding of the Italian language presented in the show, students will be taught the relevant vocabulary and language structures in class prior to the performance. Students will be exposed to spoken Italian and cultural understandings. It is compulsory for the students to attend, as they will complete a formal Viewing assessment task after the performance. Students absent on the day will complete a modified assessment task.

The performance is on Monday 5 September during Periods 5 and 6 in the Nicolas Barre Auditorium. Students will therefore not attend their normal classes in Periods 5 and 6. The cost of \$5.00 per student has already been paid, as part of the Italian levy on the booklist. 
MONEY SEE, MONKEY DO @ PERTH ZOO!

On Tuesday 16 August, our Year 11 2AB Psychology class, with Ms Steven and Mr White (Snr) attended the "Monkey See, Monkey Do" lecture at Perth Zoo. The lecture gave us an insight into how the animals at the zoo are trained and conditioned to their living environment and what psychological theories are applied to assist this process. We learnt that many different things are taken into consideration to prepare the animals for their life at the zoo or in the case of the numbat breeding programme, into the wild. Animals are conditioned or trained to perform certain behaviours when prompted by their keepers. This is either for health reasons, (for example, if they need to be weighed or given injections) as enrichment or to make sure that they know essential behaviours that would have been learnt in the wild.

The class also had a dose of super saturation therapy for Ophidiophobia (fear of snakes) when a keeper brought in a male boa constrictor that weighed over 13 kilos! Those brave enough were allowed to touch the snake.

After the lecture we were able to explore the zoo and make behavioural observations on specific animals such as the meerkats, primates and African painted dogs. We were intrigued by our observations on their different behaviours, interactions with each other and lifestyles. It was also interesting to see how psychological theories can be applied across species. Overall our excursion to the zoo was an enjoyable and informative experience.


