

Monday 31 October WACE exams begin.





**NEWS FLASH! YEAR 8 SOCIETY &
ENVIRONMENT STUDENTS GO TO TRIAL**

Upon completion of their Politics and Law unit this term, my Year 8 Society and Environment Course 1 students had the opportunity of participating in two interactive, fictitious court cases in the classroom. Half the students were involved in a criminal case 'Rottneest Island Board v Michael Creedy' and the other half were involved in a civil case 'Burgers Are Us v Jo Borrough'. The criminal case was a case of stealing a bicycle worth \$7 000 and the civil case involved a protestor from the 'Save the Earth' group who allegedly threw red paint and damaged the windows of a Burgers Are Us fast food shop.

The students in each team played the roles of barristers who argued their side of the case; solicitors who assisted the barristers during the trials; witnesses who played the role of the prosecution/plaintiff and defence; a judge's associate and court orderly who both assisted the judge/s; jurors who determined the guilt of the accused. The students were awarded points based on their performance by myself and also by Mrs Rachael Keenan and Ms Maria Palmieri who were guest judges at the trials.

In the criminal case, Michael Creedy was found not guilty of stealing and in the civil case, Jo Borrough was found not guilty of causing damage. A special mention goes to the prosecution team of the criminal case who scored the highest points amongst the 4 teams.

- ♣ **Caring Together:** recognises a group, team or club of young people who carry out volunteer work that benefits others in their community.



SHARING LASALLIAN VALUES IN PAPUA NEW GUINEA (PNG)

Teacher training and access to it is a subject close to the hearts of many in the De La Salle network of schools across Australia and New Zealand. It is also close to the hearts of the young people from PNG who are currently studying to be teachers at Sacred Heart Teachers College (SHTC) in Bomana, Port Moresby which is one of the many projects run by the Brothers and lay people in PNG.

Brother Paul Smith, CEO, Steve Byrne, Principal of St Michaels College Henley Beach and Chair of the Mission Council, and Miranda Chow, Project Manager of the Lasallian Foundation recently visited SHTC as part of the Foundation's monitoring and evaluation visits. They were inspired by the personal stories of the four students.

Each student's story demonstrated their tenacity and determination to pursue their dream of becoming a teacher – they face considerable odds. Carmel, whose village is so remote it takes two to three days to reach the nearby town, left home one month ahead of time to be sure to be at the College in time. John walked six hours through rugged terrain just to reach the station on the first leg of his journey. Some have left young babies and children at home in the care of grandparents and family only seeing them twice a year. All of the students are from remote villages where their families eke out a very meager living.

These students are inspiring not just in their passion for education but in their commitment to Lasallian values and their vision of education as a way to positively change their lives and the lives of those around them. Each of the students aspires to return to their remote village when they are qualified to share their skills and knowledge with their communities.

"Sacred Heart Teacher's College has given me hope through a chance to be educated. I want to climb the highest mountains and ridges to reach the ones whom no one else reaches out to, to touch their hearts, educate their minds and transform their lives through implementing the ideas of Lasallian education."
