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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

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In such a short period of time, so much has happened. As we conclude Week 4, our House spirits have been activated through breakfasts, swimming carnivals and Big Day Outs! At the time of this publication, we will know who our champion swimming House is; the College Swim team will have been chosen and a training regime set. Our Year 7s now know one another a little better with their participation in the Big Days Out. Our Year 7 parents were also welcomed at the Year 7 Eucharistic celebration and as is the custom of the College, they shared a sausage sizzle! Magically, 500 sausages were cooked to perfection. A very big thank you to our Canteen staff and to the Friends of La Salle College who sweated over a very hot barbecue and produced a most satisfying sausage sizzle.

These activities don't just happen. They are carefully planned and supported by dedicated staff, students and parents. We thank all who assisted in these events.

On Saturday, at La Salle Boarding, we welcomed local Noongar elder, Mrs Marie Taylor. Mrs Taylor conducted a smoking ceremony at the boarding house. As an Aboriginal elder, Mrs Taylor welcomed our Aboriginal boarding students to her land, that of the Noongar people. She presented a message stick that contained her mother's totem. She explained that the smoking ceremony is an ancient ritual among Aboriginal Australians. The smoking ceremony takes away the bad feeling that may be present the ceremony takes away one's bad thoughts that affect their spirit; it takes one back into the land. The ceremony is an important part of the Aboriginal spirit and culture. It involves smouldering various native plants to produce smoke which is believed to have cleansing properties. Accompanied by students and staff, Mrs Taylor incensed each room with Eucalyptus. Mrs Taylor concluded with warm words of encouragement and a special prayer for our boarding students. This was a very special time for our students and staff. These types of events build community. As a new community, we too offer our prayers to the students and staff at La Salle Boarding for a continued sense of belonging and wellbeing.

Week 5 is significant time for our senior students. We have our Academic and Behaviour Review for Years 10 - 12. This feedback on how your child is performing is essential in supporting their learning. At report time, there should be no surprises with regards to a child's performance. Feedback that is provided as an outcome of this review should offer students, parents and guardians a clearer picture of one's progress and commitment to their studies. Also during Week 5, our Year 12 students participate in their final retreat. This faith forming opportunity will provide a wonderful time for each to be still and come to know their relationship with God a little bit better. We pray for our Year 12s during this time that they may be recharged in their faith, renew friendships in relaxed settings and connect with their search for meaning and purpose in their lives. We thank our staff who so willingly give of their time away from their families to attend this important event.

Finally, the excellent standing of La Salle College in our community suggests that there is great cooperation amongst our families and the College in ensuring that the College agreement is fulfilled. One visible sign of this excellent standing is the wearing of the College uniform and our students public behaviour as students come and go from the College, they are on show. On the whole our students wear their uniform with great pride and behave in public appropriately. However, it is disturbing to receive contact from members of the local community who reported that three La Salle students were not observing the road rules whilst walking home. Safety of our students is paramount. We need our students to be vigilant on how they conduct themselves on the roads. It is timely as parents that you stress to your children attentiveness on the roads and the following of road rules. We do not get a second chance.

- Hospitality**
Responsibility: To provide hospitality and catering to College functions as required (e.g. sausage sizzle for a busy bee, assist with catering at the Art Exhibition). Activities are coordinated with the assistance of the Canteen and Hospitality Manager.
- Parent Education**
Responsibility: Consider and organise various guest speakers/seminars for parents on topics that are relevant or topical (e.g. boys education, eating disorders etc.).
- Fundraising**
Responsibility: Assisting with the organisation and supporting specific fundraising events within the College (e.g. the Quiz Night).
- Grounds and Maintenance**
Responsibility: Assisting with 'busy bees' and providing input and suggestions to the College's maintenance schedule.
- Policy Consultation**
Responsibility: Providing feedback and a sounding board to the College Board and Senior Leadership Team on matters of policy.
- Boarding**
Responsibility: Assisting House Parents with hospitality and sewing.
- Miscellaneous**
This group does not meet but offers assistance for specific events which were indicated on the Parent Volunteer Form which was posted out to all families earlier in the year. (Extra copies available at the College Office).

Meetings are held in Terms 1, 2 and 3. Members of the Senior Leadership Team along with Board members work with each group to plan activities for the year. The FOLSC is different to the traditional P&F, or P&C. We do not have an agenda, minutes are not taken and meetings run for no longer than one hour each.

Our first, and most important meeting, occurs on Tuesday 8 March at 7:00 pm. At the first meeting we set the outline for the year.

ICT Quick Tip #2 - Customise the Quick Access Toolbar in Office 2010

Note: You'll find the Quick Access Toolbar in Office 2003 and 2007 too.

1. Open any Office application e.g. Outlook, Word, PowerPoint or Excel. Locate the Quick Access Toolbar (Figure 1) in the top-left of your window. By default three icons will appear - save, undo and redo.
2. Use the 'Customize' button (drop-down arrow found to the right of the toolbar) to add listed commands such as the Spelling & Grammar. Alternatively, select More Commands from the Popular Commands list or from the All Commands list. Add to the menu.
3. You can right-click on any command on the Ribbon and add to the Quick Access Toolbar.

Even if you were vaccinated as a child the immunity fades after 6 to 10 years.
