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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

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IMPORTANT PRESS RELEASE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF CATHOLIC EDUCATION

Catholic Education in Western Australia welcomes the next phase of the MySchool website. The data from our schools illustrates the effectiveness of Catholic Education in Western Australia and the diversity in our school communities. Catholic schools are focused on ensuring equity of access and opportunity. Catholic schools are located throughout Western Australia from Kununurra to Esperance. Of these, eight are in remote Indigenous communities where this is the only available school. The high cost of running these schools is an ongoing issue for all involved in education. Increased government commitment to such students will continue to help address the educational outcomes for these students. The high cost of educating students with disabilities is also illustrated on the MySchool website with special education centres requiring significant recurrent income per student. Students with disabilities have access to a mainstream education in Catholic schools and so the real cost is not as easily identified within the individual school data. An ongoing commitment from governments and education authorities to funding for these students regardless of the sector in which they attend will be a significant step forward in improving the educational outcomes for this group of students.

While having this information available to parents and the community in general is applauded, we have a concern that this small window into each school may be used as the sole basis for judging schools. The reality is that important aspects of our school communities such as religion, pastoral care, sense of belonging and diversity are not reflected on the MySchool website. I also have no doubt that there will be particular comparisons made between schools that will result in much time being spent explaining variances when the time should more productively be used in providing a better education for our students.




The students will be leaving the College at approximately 9:00 am and will return to school in time to catch their usual transport home.

The Catholic Education Aboriginal Committee (CEAC) is a standing committee of the Catholic Education Commission of Western Australia (CECWA). Reporting to the CEAC standing committee are four diocesan committees. Membership of the Perth, Bunbury, Geraldton and Broome CEAC is drawn from local Aboriginal communities.

The general objectives of CEAC are:

- To ensure that Aboriginal children receive quality Catholic education.
- To enable members to play an active role in the Catholic Education Commission of WA's consultative process.
- To give Aboriginal people the opportunity to have a direct voice in Catholic education.
- To allow Aboriginal people to seek advice from an Aboriginal committee in the area of Catholic Aboriginal education. Any advice given must be with the approval of the Director of Catholic Education and/or the CECWA.
- To direct the concerns of Aboriginal people to the appropriate bodies.
- To enable staff in Catholic schools to have a better understanding of Aboriginal culture.

All Aboriginal families at La Salle are encouraged to seek further information about membership on a diocesan CEAC. Meetings are held three times per year in Terms 2, 3 and 4. The first meetings for each diocese will be held in April.



The Supreme Court of Western Australia hosts the annual Inter-School Mock Trial competition for high schools. Students in teams of up to 12 compete against each other in front of a qualified judge to argue and persuade their side of a fictitious case.

The College has entered two teams in the competition and have seen some good initial results after the first round.


The idea behind this competition is to give students an opportunity to explore the concepts of law and to put them into practice in realistic scenarios. Each team is split up into six roles such as: 2 barristers, 1 solicitor, 2 witnesses and a court orderly. Overall, students gain and develop skills of public speaking and how to handle situations when 'put on the spot' by the judge.

After many hours of training and hard work over three weeks, Team A, went up against Penrhos College, winning the case but unfortunately losing overall by one and a half points. On the other hand, Team B defeated Carey Baptist College by 3 points. 


LA SALLE JUNIOR FOOTBALL CLUB
