Teachers and support staff went back into the classroom this week when they attended the second series of Staff ICT-PD workshops held after school. Participants chose a topic of interest from a range of ICT-based themes which were delivered by La Salle College teaching staff.

These included:

- \*\* the use of Simon for curriculum delivery (Simon is the College's learning platform introduced in 2011)
- \*\* developing an open ended, problem solving approach to learning using the Virtual Mathomat software in the classroom
- \*\* the importance of teaching ICT explicitly across the Curriculum
- \*\* the importance of cyber awareness for digital citizens

In addition to these topics we were fortunate to have an outside presenter, Lisa Chanmala, the Account Manager - Western Australia for Computelec, who delivered a hands-on workshop on the use of Microsoft's OneNote software in an educational setting. Participants in Ms Chanmala's workshop extend their sincere thanks for an informative and engaging session.

The Staff ICT-PD focuses on the meaningful integration of ICT-based tools in the Curriculum that will empower our staff and students, not only in an educational setting, but also in their personal communication and socialisation.

## YEAR 11 STUDENTS IN 2011 - HAVE YOU CONSIDERED A CAREER IN NURSING?

The transition programme is an innovative and practical programme run in partnership between industry and education.

The programme was established with four overarching objectives in mind:

- To introduce students to the nursing profession during Years 11 and 12 through structured workplace and off-the-job learning experience.
- To provide appropriate transition experiences in aged care that lead to students who are suitably prepared for studies in Registered Nursing.
- To add value to current procedures and to identify other important attributes in prospective entrants that may not be determined in the current tertiary entrance ranking selection process.
- To reduce attrition rates in the nursing workforce in the first few years following graduation.

Students are selected to participate in the programme through a competitive application process.

To be eligible for selection, students must:

- Be studying courses that will lead to a potential ATAR of 70 or greater in Year 12.
- Submit a written application, comprising:

- \*\* \* A completed application form (Form A)
- \*\* \* Copies of their two most recent school reports
- \*\* \* The school reference form (Form B)

Students are short-listed for interview on the basis of their written application and the academic ability to complete the course.

Interview panels comprise one representative from the Education sector and one representative with a Registered Nursing background.

Final student selection is based on the written application and interview performance. Up to 20 students will be accepted into the programme this year.



## U/16 FEMALE WEST AUSTRALIAN TRIATHLETE OF THE YEAR 2010 - 2011

I have been competing in triathlons for the past 8 years since I was 7, having been a member of North Coast Triathlon Club for 3 years. The most challenging aspect of this sport is that an athlete has to possess excellence and discipline for not one but three different sports: swimming, cycling and running in consecutive order. I train six days a week, some days in the morning and in the evening. My training schedule goes something like this: I swim on Tuesday and Friday; cycle on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday and run on Thursday.

I would say my biggest rival is myself, as I have to overcome my own weaknesses first before I can overcome anything else. My triathlon goals are to make the State team again in the 2011/2012 season and to make both La Salle College and Western Australia proud. I would also like to get into the *Triathlon Excellence Programme* which is a state talent identification programme to train young junior triathletes in Western Australia to represent Australia. My long term goals are to make the Australian team and hopefully, attain the World Champion title and become an influential athlete in the sporting world. Some advice to teens who want to get into this sport is that commitment, dedication and determination are the most important aspects in order to excel. You must be willing to sacrifice time for training, but it is a feeling greater than words when achievements are made. You need to put in as much as you want to get out of it and never ask any more than your best but never give any less than your best.

The Triathlete of the Year award in each age group is awarded at the Triathlon Western Australia Annual Awards Night to recognise the achievements and success of athletes in Triathlon in the 2010/2011 season. Winning this award was amazing and somewhat unbelievable. All the sacrifices and hard training have paid off and I am very proud and will cherish this award of recognition throughout my life. I would sincerely like to thank my coaches, especially my dad for all his support and encouragement and who also happens to be my club's cycling coach. Thank you to my club for continuing to provide me with opportunities and support. To La Salle College and especially the PE department, thank you for continued support. *Lastly but most importantly, to my dear parents who sacrifice everything for me so that I can be everything I can be and achieve everything I can achieve. They made sure I had every opportunity, and because of that I owe my achievements to my parents as much as to myself.*




