### **AUSTRALIAN MATHEMATICS COMPETITION**

On Thursday 2 August, Week 2, Term 3 Mathematics students will take part in the Australian Mathematics Competition.

This event was introduced in Australia in 1978 as the first competition in Australian Schools. In this time it has served almost all Australian secondary schools, providing feedback and enrichment to schools and students. It has become the largest single event on the Australian Education Calendar, allowing students to attempt the same tasks, on the same day in about 40 countries. It has become a truly international event, with countries throughout the Pacific and South East Asia, and some from even further afield taking part.

The aims of the competition are three-fold:

-  To highlight the importance of mathematics as a curriculum subject.
-  To give students an opportunity to discover talent in mathematics.
-  To provide resources for the classroom and general discussion.



## HAVE YOU SEEN AUTO COLLAGE FROM MICROSOFT LABS?

It's a great tool to turn your favourite photos into a collage. It replaces those multi-photo frames we all have hanging in the house somewhere! After you make the collage, the possibilities are many: book covers, assignment title pages, framed, placemats, calendars, jigsaws, printed onto crockery, fabric etc.

Type "**Microsoft Autocollage download**" into a search engine and download a 6 month trial version. You may elect to buy the full software after seeing what it can do. As you can see, there is a watermark on the trial version. It's not hard to crop it out using Microsoft Paint or any other photo management software. You can have as few as 7 pictures or as many as 50 pictures in your collage.

## WALLWISHER – GIVE YOUR FRIDGE, PHONE & FACEBOOK A REST!

Post sticky notes on Wallwisher and let people add to your wall. Wallwisher is a Web2.0 tool, meaning it's a live website that allows contributions from people over the internet. It's a great way to build up ideas and share information. You have authority to allow or disallow anything before it's posted. Just email the link to whom you want to be involved and they can see the wall and contribute.

Here's one that Wallwisher itself used to get customer ideas:

There's plenty of potential for organisational, social and educational use. There's a range of colour schemes, and you can include pictures and sound/video as part of your posts. You can have your first wall up in minutes. Email the link to your friends or work partners and then allow many heads to be better than one! *Collaboration is an essential feature of 21<sup>st</sup> century learning.*


