PARKING AND TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AT THE COLLEGE - ONGOING REMINDER

Parents are reminded that they should be using the "kiss and drop" zone located in La Salle Avenue when dropping off or picking up their children from the College. Entry to the College is via the eastern entrance (gate closest to Great Northern Highway). Vehicles need to proceed through the staff car park, turn right (heading north) and then complete the loop down past the maintenance sheds before proceeding south to the "kiss and drop" zone which is now the full length of La Salle Avenue.

When you have dropped off/picked up your child from any point along the "kiss and drop" zone you should carefully move to the middle lane and exit the College. Parking restrictions will be in place along La Salle Avenue from 8:00 am to 9:00 am and between 2:30 pm and 3:30 pm. This will allow clear vehicle access down (north) La Salle Avenue to the turning circle before coming to the "kiss and drop" zone.

I would also ask parents to be mindful of parking regulations as they apply to nearby streets. Vehicles parked illegally are subject to the by-laws of the City of Swan and fines may result if drivers infringe these regulations.

JOINT INTERAGENCY TRUANCY REDUCTION INITIATIVE

This initiative has all three educational sectors working with police in the metropolitan area to help reduce truancy from school and increase safety in our communities. Any children located by police during school hours outside school grounds who are unaccompanied by an adult and do not have a leave pass will be returned to their enrolled school. Students who need to leave during the day will be issued a leave pass from Student Reception and need to keep this on them if unaccompanied by a parent or guardian.

If your child is collected by police and returned to school, a staff member from the school will call to inform you and will send a Parental Information Slip to you. Parents will be given the location where their child was found and the details of the police officer who returned them. There will be a police contact number for parents if there are any concerns.

This initiative commenced on 24 July 2012. We encourage parents to support schools and the police in reducing truancy and ensuring that children are safe.


A group of Year 10 and Year 11 students will be attending La Salle College's inaugural Italian Exchange Programme and Study Tour of Italy in September/October of this year.

At La Salle College we promote and encourage our students to be responsible computer users. Here are some tips for all students, including students with notebooks:

Run out of **storage space**? Check your student folder on a regular basis. How? Click on Start | Computer | and look at the colour of the bar for your student account. Make sure you also check the amount of storage space left too.

- If the bar is **blue** you still have storage space (but make sure you check how much).
- If the bar is **red** your storage space is almost full. Start backing up your work. Save files to a USB and/or a home computer then delete the files you don't need (*personal photos, videos and audio including iTunes should not to be saved in your student folder*).
- If there is **no bar** showing you have **no space!** Follow the instructions above to back up, save and delete files that are no longer needed.

Students with notebooks can save unwanted files to the **Storage** folder on Local Disk C.

Cannot **access the Internet** at school - what should you do? Check your PaperCut account. How?

- At school click on Start | All Programs | Network Places & Programs | open Check Your Balance (Printing, Internet & Photocopying) then use your username and password to access PaperCut. Remember to log out when finished!

Students with notebooks should do the following:

- First check that your notebook wireless switch is on.
- Next, check that the Proxy Server is selected. How? Open Internet Explorer |Tools (top right) | Internet Options | Connections tab | LAN settings and check that the Proxy Server is checked (ticked).

ST NORBERT'S PLUMBING & PAINTING SCHOOL BASED PRE-APPRENTICESHIPS 2013

School based pre-apprenticeship programmes are being offered by MPA Skills in both plumbing and painting for 2013. The programme is being run at the Floreffe Trade Training Centre at the St Norbert College campus. These programmes are designed to give the students a good grounding in the plumbing and painting industry. The MPA Skills group is also an apprentice employment agency and as a result students who show skill in their particular field, along with dedication and a positive attitude are frequently offered an apprenticeship once they have completed the course.

Summary of the school based pre-apprenticeships programmes offered:

Plumbing and Gas Fitting (Cert II) and Painting and Decorating (Cert II)

- Training one day per week- with work experience placements run during the school holidays.
- Students attend their current schools on the other 4 days.
- Open to both Year 11 and 12 students- students who have completed work experience previously are most likely to be successful.
- Enrolments end 31 August.

The course will begin in January 2013 and run for the whole year.






