LATE TO SCHOOL

La Salle College values punctuality to school and to class. There has been a growing trend by students to arrive late to school as a matter of habit, either late to PCG or missing it entirely. Sleeping in as an excuse is not acceptable and students need to be organised to be in attendance on time. School begins at 8:25 am and it is the expectation that all students are on campus and in PCG on time. Unfortunately, sanctions are now in place for those students who regularly arrive late. Students will know this as 20-20-Tuesday. When a student accumulates 20 minutes of late time, a lunch detention will be issued. A further 20 minutes of late time accumulation will result in a further lunch detention. On the third occasion a Tuesday detention will be issued.

Parents are urged to ensure that their child is on time. If there is an unforeseen event, such as a mechanical issue, please write a note explaining the reason for your child's lateness to school. Your support in this matter will be greatly appreciated.

Embed Live Video or Audio into your PowerPoint presentations!

Many students (of all ages, parents included!) use Microsoft PowerPoint to present a body of knowledge to their teachers, students and peers. Here are a couple of ways to get live internet video or audio into your PowerPoint presentations.

Audio. First find the live streaming on the internet. For example, let's use our local radio station www.Mix.com.au. After a quick search through their website you will find the URL for their live radio is <http://www.mix.com.au/player> Other radio stations will have something similar. They also offer pre-recorded podcasts which you can download to your computer.

To insert Live Streaming:

1. Find the radio station's live player and copy (Ctrl-C) the URL (eg <http://www.mix.com.au/player>)
2. Go to your PowerPoint slide and create a textbox.
3. In the textbox, paste (Ctrl-V) the URL.
4. When you run your slide show (F5), clicking on the URL will play live radio to your audience. The sound will continue even if you advance the slide show. Close the browser player window to stop it.

To insert a Podcast:

1. Find the podcast on the radio website and save it to your own computer.
2. Check the website for any copyright obligations applying to the podcast.
3. Go to your PowerPoint slide and insert tab | Audio | from File
4. Place the sound file icon on your slide and decorate it with appropriate pictures etc.
5. Run the slide show (F5) and click the sound icon to play the podcast. It will stop if you advance the slide show.



YouTube Video

This is a gem because your PowerPoint slide becomes a YouTube screen with a play button. While it's easy to do, the instructions won't fit here. For a fully illustrated how-to sheet, please go to:

STAYING HEALTHY SERIES PART 2: LOOKING AFTER YOUR MENTAL HEALTH

Staying mentally healthy is just as important as being physically healthy! Being mentally healthy is about wellbeing and more than just the absence of illness. It is about being able to cope with the stressors of life and being able to contribute to the community personally and professionally! As per the Staying Healthy Series Part 1 - being physically active is great and has many benefits contributing to your mental wellbeing. So here it is, Part 2 in the Staying Healthy Series; things you can think about doing to stay mentally healthy!

- ✎ Keep in contact with friends and family, go out and have some fun. Socialising is important for your wellness!
- ✎ Do something you enjoy, a sport, a hobby or participating in a club. It may even be something small like completing a suduko or crossword.
- ✎ You could even write down a list all of the things that you enjoy doing and then spend some time enjoying yourself and doing them!
- ✎ Do something altruistic, try a random act of kindness and experience the *buzz* and instant mood life it can provide. You may even consider being a volunteer or helping someone else closer to home.
- ✎ 3 things: at the end of every busy day write down 3 things that have been great and *why!* It may be a small thing like "My friends were so nice to me today and complimented my new hairstyle. This was great as I felt really beautiful/ handsome" or something bigger "I felt great after helping my elderly neighbour out, because she struggles to do things by herself and I feel so useful and helpful giving her a hand". This activity becomes addictive and makes even the worst days have some highlights you can look back on!
- ✎ Balance your time; don't spend it doing all one thing e.g. studying for 6 hours a day! Space it out with a social activity or by exercising in between those things that you have to get done!
- ✎ Time management, prioritise. Ask yourself what do I have to get done today? What are the 3 most important things to complete? Then move on to the other things. Lists can be really useful to keep you focused.

MENINGOCOCCAL AWARENESS DAY - Friday 7 September

Meningococcal disease is a rare, very serious illness which usually appears as meningitis (inflammation of the protective coverings of the brain and spinal cord) or Septicaemia (blood poisoning which is a more widespread infection throughout the body).

Meningococcal disease is caused by bacteria and not by a virus, it is transmitted via mucus. Meningococcal bacteria can live harmlessly in the throat and nose. Around 20% of people will be carrying these bacteria at any one time without ever becoming ill from it; these people are called healthy carriers. In fact, all of us will carry them at some stage in our lives.

The meningococcal bacteria are spread by activities such as sneezing, coughing, kissing, and sharing food or drinks. Environments where people are in close contact make it easier for the bacteria to spread. The Meningococcal disease can strike both children and adults, primarily teenagers and young adults due to their social lifestyles.

Vaccines are available, however as there is more than one strain and the vaccine does not immunise all three strains it is important to take precautions such as avoiding sharing drinks, lips balms and lip sticks.



Friday 7 September is Meningococcal Awareness Day; this day is a reminder to take precautions to ensure you're doing whatever you can so meningococcal disease doesn't strike you. For more information visit <http://www.amandayoungfoundation.org.au/>

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION UPDATE

On 21 March this year, Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB was installed as the sixth Archbishop of Perth. In his opening homily, His Grace invited us all to ask ourselves the question: *Where is Jesus in what I am doing?* He encouraged all of us - both staff, students and parents- to be motivated and inspired by these words. All Australian Bishops have also invited us to "contemplate the face of Christ" in this Year of Grace.






DRAMA


