QUALITY CATHOLIC SCHOOLING SURVEYS

Earlier in the year a sample of students, staff and parents were invited to participate in a series of surveys designed to support the College's Quality Catholic Schooling (QCS) programme. QCS is a framework for school improvement operating in all Catholic schools in WA.

The surveys will be conducted each year for five years as a means of identifying trends in school improvement. The results of the surveys, which are managed by an external data company, provide schools with areas of celebration and opportunities for improvement. The College's Senior Leadership Team will continue to work with staff to develop strategies to build upon the data which has been collected.

Of significant interest was the strong affirmation of La Salle by parents and students as a place which nurtures and pastorally cares for its students. The facilities provided by the College and clear direction of the College's vision and mission were also highlighted as significant strengths of the College.

The 2012 data will become the benchmark for the College to seek to continually improve the educational, pastoral, spiritual and social outcomes for our students.

The last day of term also marks the end of formal classes for our Year 12 students. Their final school exams commence in the second week of the October holidays. Some students will also undertake their final WACE practical exams during the holidays. 1 Clean up your "My Documents" folders





Another backup on a USB drive


Go through your subject folders and drag any document you no longer need to your Storage Folder on C: drive. Drag it also to a USB. That gives you two copies. *Then delete the document from My Documents.* This saves valuable space on the College servers.

2 Clean up your Outlook Email

Emails can build up and soon your mailbox is full. You can set up a status bar to continually show you how full your mailbox is.




Right click the corner of Outlook screen and tick everything. You'll see your mailbox status all the time now.



Find the Large Emails. These are the space wasters. Usually attachments are the cause. Outlook can show you the "Large Mail".

Make the Search Folders visible.
Click Large Mail



Go through the **large mail** and **delete** what you don't need. **Right-click attachments to save them** if desired. **Delete** the email.

There are many other things you can do to clean up your email. It all takes time, but it's worth it. **Remember, emails can be dragged into a folder for safe-keeping and deleted from Outlook.**

Now you've been through and deleted unwanted emails, delete them again from the Deleted items folder. To do this, go to the Deleted items folder, **Ctrl-A** to select them all, **Delete key**, and **confirm**.

TAX FILE NUMBERS

As a courtesy service to our students, La Salle is a member of the ATO's School Tax File Number Programme. This enables students in all year groups to apply for a Tax File Number (TFN) on an abbreviated form, with no need for copies of official documents such as birth certificates, passports and the like through La Salle. All students in Year 9 are provided with the opportunity to apply for a TFN in their CDT classes in Term 1 each year. This service is exactly that – a courtesy. With the growing number of students at La Salle, the administration of the programme has become quite intensive. It should be noted that once we post applications to the ATO, the Privacy Act then prevents anyone other than the student (including a parent) to enquire as to its progress. As a result, we would ask all families to note the following:

- TFN forms will be sent to the ATO at the start of each calendar month only. It takes 28 days for the ATO to process the form and issue the student with a TFN.
- Students who require a TFN quickly and cannot wait until the end of the month, plus an additional 28 days, are advised to apply for a TFN using the form at the Post Office; not through the school.
- Whilst all due care is taken with the handling of TFN Application forms, La Salle College does not keep a record of forms received and cannot be held responsible for forms the ATO does not receive.

Students can come to the Careers and Transitions Centre in the SLC to collect and return TFN Application forms during recess or lunch breaks at any time.

POLYTECHNIC WEST – FAMILY OF TRADES CONSTRUCTION

If you are interested in the trades but you're not really sure which one is for you, then the Certificate I in Trades Construction is a great choice for you. Students undertaking this course will get a taste of working in 5 trade areas learning from lecturers who are qualified tradesmen with years of industry experience.


