





Avoid oversharing personal information

Facebook, a business organisation out to make a profit for its shareholders, saw its advertising revenue this year (\$US 992 million) up 28% from the previous year. Its primary aim is to gather information and every time you click 'like' Facebook discovers some more of your personal information. Avoid oversharing information; disable your name from appearing next to advertisements. How? Check out CNET's 'Remove your name from Facebook social ads' @ howto.cnet.com/8301-11310_39-57475395-285/remove-your-name-from-facebook-social-ads/.

Avoid continued monitoring

I've logged off Facebook so they can't gather any more information about me. Wrong! Facebook can continue to monitor your Internet activity if you use 'Facebook Connect' or other social plug-ins. Facebook can set up a cookie to continue to gather information about your online activities. 
