



IMPORTANT YEAR 10 INFORMATION

Year 10 Examination Period

The last day of scheduled classes for Year 10 students will occur on **Friday 23 November**, as they have examinations from 26 November to 6 December. Students are only expected to be at school for their scheduled examinations. A number of supervised study rooms will be available during this time period. Only students doing examinations or using the study rooms are permitted at the College. The students undertaking the GCE course will have work experience at this time.

Year 10 Notebook Computers

The notebook computers issued to students at the beginning of this year are having software upgrades applied during the Christmas vacation. We will therefore be collecting the machines from Year 10 students in the week prior to examinations. The IT Support staff will:

-  Upgrade the operating system to Windows 8
-  Install MS Office 2013
-  Check for any faults or damage

This will allow the students to take full advantage of the touch screens on the notebook computers. If faults or damages are found, which are not covered under warranty, the machine will be repaired under the *Accidental Damage Insurance Policy*. Unfortunately if this is the case a \$100 excess will be billed to the parents.

NEW LOCK PROCEDURE FOR STUDENTS

From 2013 students will be responsible for securing their College supplied locker. The College will only supply a lock to students upon their commencement at the school; thereafter students will be responsible for the maintaining of this lock and the securing of their locker. All students will be advised by their Pastoral Care Advisor (PCA) of the exact process. In brief:

-  At the end of the school year: students empty their locker and take the lock home.
-  At the beginning of the school year: students are assigned a locker and secure it with the retained lock or another lock supplied by them.

To ensure that all personal academic materials are secure a fully functional lock must be on each student locker at all times. If a student does not supply their own lock one will be obtained from Student Reception and a fee will then be charged.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus our Saviour

STUDY SKILLS TIP FOR NOVEMBER: Independent Learning

Some students take a long time to realise that there are actually two types of work in secondary school. There is the obvious work, the work your teacher specifically tells you to do and that is compulsory such as: homework, working on assignments, preparing for tests and assessments. But students who get good results in school take a larger measure of responsibility for their learning, this means that the nights where they do not have much compulsory work, they also do independent learning. These are the additional things you do, if you have no other schoolwork to do that night, to improve your understanding of your subjects. It is what students who get good marks are doing; they are just not talking about it to their friends!

Examples of independent learning:

-  Reading
-  Reviewing what you have been learning at school that week
-  Extra practice on questions you find hard
-  Research on an area you are interested in learning more about
-  Making a mind map about what you have been learning
-  Making study notes on a topic
-  Improving your touch typing skills
-  Reading ahead in your textbook
-  Improving your study skills (you can complete units on www.studyskillshandbook.com.au)
-  Doing work from a different textbook or study guide for one of your subjects (check the school library, local library and bookshops)

Some nights you will not have time to do any independent learning. Other nights you will have no homework and will spend the whole time allocated to schoolwork for that night working on independent learning tasks. Your teacher may even give you a sheet that has suggestions of independent learning work for that subject. If you are unsure, you can always ask. This means in secondary school you can never say 'I have nothing to do' – this really just means 'I have nothing compulsory to do at the moment!'

Your children are developing their digital reputation. This will most likely play a vital part in securing employment in their adult life. In fact, a student's digital reputation is being reviewed as part of their application to a higher education institution in America! As a parent of a child using a social media site you play an important role in educating and guiding your child's online activity. How can you guide and educate them?

Here are some tips:

-  Know what your children are doing online – if they are on Facebook, open an account and 'friend' your child and their friends. Talk to them about their online behaviour.
-  Talk to your child about the pitfalls of being online – monitor your child's social media site settings. Check out Cybersmart @ www.cybersmart.gov.au/en/Parents.aspx.
-  Teach your child the importance of their digital reputation – get them to regularly check their online presence. Google their first and last name, as well as their first, middle and surname – don't forget to check online images too!
-  Know the technologies your child is using – do you have access to your child's Facebook password? Do you determine when your child is able to access their Facebook site?
-  Talk to your child about what to do if they are in a situation where they feel uncomfortable online.
-  Make sure your child is aware of what personal information they can and cannot share online. Are you considering a new phone for your child's Christmas present? Make sure the phone's GPS feature is set to 'Emergency Only' to limit the location detail tagged on photos uploaded from the phone to a social media site.
-  Report any inappropriate, harmful or criminal online activity – check out www.thinkuknow.org.au for more information.
-  Consider having your child use the computer in a room where you can monitor their online activity rather than the bedroom or in a room where you cannot monitor.
-  Turn off the modem after a set time at night. Make sure it's not accessible to turn on in the early hours when everyone else is asleep. Alternatively, find out how to change the modem's IP address.


GARDEN SHEDS FOR SALE

VISUAL ARTS

2012 has been a very rewarding year for Visual Arts. It is my pleasure to congratulate two of our very dedicated group of our Year 12 students - Tracey Theseira and Madison Italiano. They have been given the prestigious honour of being selected to exhibit in the 2013 Year 12 'Perspectives' Exhibition, at the Art Gallery of Western Australia. The last time that the College was represented in the Perspectives was in 2005, with Caitlin Talijancich's painting, 'Brass Monkey'.

Tracey Theseira's oil painting, 'The Dynamic Duos' diptych focuses on a series of amazingly complex relationship dynamics. Each one of the characters in each of the paintings has a counterpart character that illustrates a different type of relationship. For example; Sherlock Holmes and John Watson in *Sherlock* shows the relationship between flatmates, Sheldon Cooper and Penny in *The Big Bang Theory* are good friends that have nothing in common, Neal Caffrey and Peter Burke in *White Collar* are work colleagues, Barney Stinson and Robin in *How I met your Mother* have the love interest dynamic, Merlin and Morgana from *The Adventures of Merlin* are enemies and lastly The Doctor and the TARDIS in *Doctor Who* are lifelong companions.

Madison Italiano has immortalised her fellow Year 12 students, Kade Meyer and Hannah Ireland in her oil and mixed media painting 'Anti-Social Network'. In creating this artwork, she has been influenced by her own context as a young Australian in 2012 – referencing our dependency on mobile phones, iPods and computers – and how these things have changed relationships, getting to know people, and the way we communicate with others. This painting poses the question: Will in the future, technology become so advanced that no one communicates face to face?

PIBT provides a pathway for students who may have marginally missed out on direct entry to University. The pathway provides a smoother transition from a high school learning environment to University.




