On 21 March, our new Archbishop, Tim Costelloe, will be installed at a Mass at St Mary's Cathedral. Bishop Costelloe is currently an Auxilliary Bishop in Melbourne, having worked in Perth in the 1990s as a parish priest and lecturer in theology at the University of Notre Dame Australia.



STUDY SKILLS TIP FOR MARCH: 7 COMMON MISTAKES IN APPROACHES TO STUDYING

Every time you have a test, quiz or exam this year, refer back to this list during your preparation to ensure you are not making these common mistakes in your approach to studying:

1. Not making study notes on a regular basis, instead, waiting till just before the test or exam.
2. Not finishing the study notes early enough before the test so there is not enough time to learn them properly or practise.
3. Not making the study notes brain-friendly and structured in a way that makes them easy to learn.
4. Not testing yourself to see if you know the content or not, just reading your notes over and over.
5. Not using a wide range of study techniques, being lazy and just using the same old techniques, regardless of whether they are working for you or not.
6. Not doing practise for exams under exam conditions (ie time limits and not looking at notes or answers).
7. Not doing questions from a wide enough range of sources e.g. Study guides, Creelman, past exams and tests etc. in addition to text questions.

The aim should be that by the end of the term you will have eliminated any of these common mistakes that you may be prone to.

Value homework:

Show you value education by expecting your children to develop regular homework habits, not just for work set by their teachers but also for revision, reinforcement and research. When your children show you their work, remember you are their most important coach and cheerleader. Let their teacher do the marking while you provide encouragement and support.




Library News



Our first round against Helena College was played in hot conditions on Tuesday afternoon. Stay tuned for results in the weeks to come.






