With the explosion of cyber technology, we are also seeing a dramatic rise in the negative impact of such technology. The issue of cyber bullying, harassment and 'sexting' is emerging as the number one issue confronting the safety and wellbeing of young people and the wider community. With the popularity of social networking sites such as, Facebook and Twitter, today's youth have access to and are accessible by many millions of people worldwide.

Teens are often not aware that their words and or photos, which may have been intended for a small audience, sometimes find their way to a larger one, often with both unexpected and undesirable consequences.

Susan will be presenting sessions to our entire student population. She will be focusing on personal safety, social media sites, being a good cyber citizen, cyber bullying as a crime and digital reputation. The sessions being tailored to suit our varied age groups (Year 7 to 12). This will be happening in the Patricia Rodrigues Centre on Thursday 29 March. All students will have the opportunity to listen and learn about the impact of social networking and its associated dangers.


### WHAT CAN PARENTS TO DO HELP?

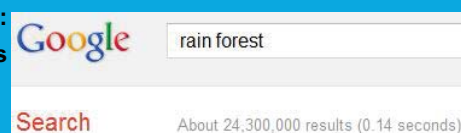


## GETTING ONLY THE GOOD STUFF OUT OF GOOGLE

Use **site:** to narrow your search to only certain sites.

Example: Searching **rain forest site:qld.gov.au** will only give pages in Qld government sites, a far more reputable source when it comes to Australian rain forests. Similarly, **rain forests site:csiro.au** will only give pages on the CSIRO site, and **rain forests site:edu.au** will give only pages from educational institutions.



*You can tell a person's character by the company they keep.* A web site's reputation and usefulness can be judged by what other sites carry links to them. For example, searching **perth dentists link:www.ada.org.au** will only give sites about perth dentists who also have links to the Australian Dental Association.

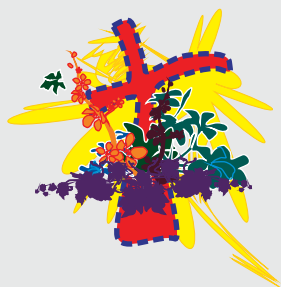


## **WAAPA EXCURSION**

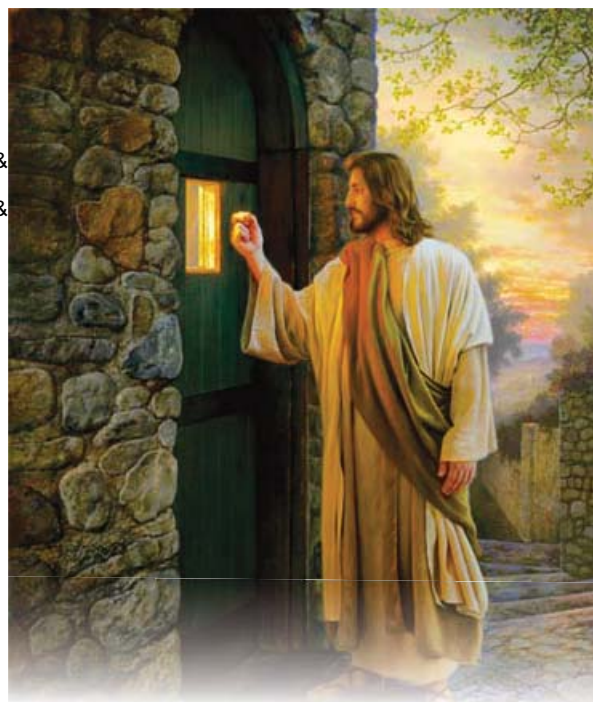

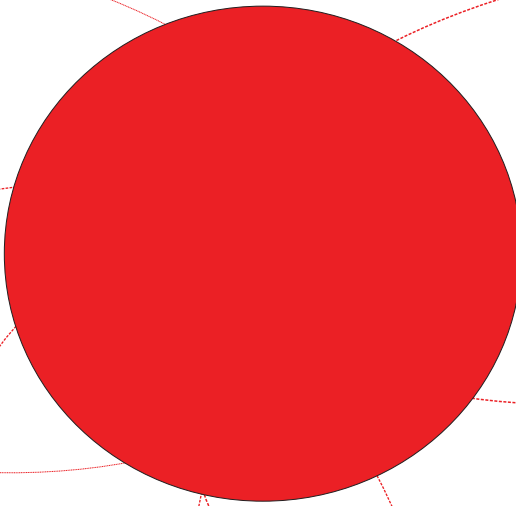
