STUDY SKILLS TIP FOR APRIL: MAKING EXCUSES NOT TO STUDY

It is very easy to come up with lots of reasons not to do your schoolwork. "I'm too tired". "There is other stuff I'd rather be doing". "It's boring, I can't be bothered".

But these are just excuses and the way students try to justify to themselves that it is okay not to do the work.

If you are having trouble getting started when you get home each afternoon, here are some tips to help:

1. As soon as you get home, unpack your bag immediately and lay out the work to be done in piles on your bed or the floor. Then walk away and have your break. It is easier to come back and start if all you have to do is pick up the first pile and begin.
2. Set an alarm in your mobile phone for when you will start work.
3. Start with something easy and achievable to get into a good rhythm and mind space.
4. Prioritise the rest of the work for the evening, what is most important? What is most urgent? What has to be done tonight?
5. Set yourself a reward for completing a certain amount of work.
6. Keep schoolwork and personal life separate, don't do work in front of the television or Facebook; instead do schoolwork in focused half hour blocks.
7. Choose a friend to help keep you on track. Discuss before you leave school what you need to get done that night, then decide a time to check in eg 9:00 pm. Even though it is just your friend who is ringing to check up on you, it is amazing how much more motivated you will be to do the work when you know someone is checking up on you!



YEAR 7 & 8 PARENTS



Aussie Optimism: Social Life Skills Programme (Year 7) and the **Optimistic Thinking Skills Programme** (Year 8). This is merely a taster of the information to come!

Aussie Optimism is a comprehensive school based programme that is linked to the curriculum. It aims to promote mental health and wellbeing in children and prevent emotional problems such as depression and anxiety. The **Social Life Skills** programme in particular provides learning experiences to build social support and interpersonal skills such as social problem solving and communication skills. The **Optimistic Thinking Skills** programme provides learning experiences to combat risk factors such as pessimism, negative thinking styles and low self-esteem in an effort to build resilience and self-management skills.

The late childhood and early adolescence years are an important developmental period for the **promotion of mental health** in children and young people. Therefore, the content and activities of the programme have been specifically designed to suit upper primary and lower secondary students and are particularly good at supporting students making the transition from primary school to secondary school.

The programme promotes collaboration between schools, parents and communities to model these attitudes and values, to create a secure and nurturing environment and to use 'real life' situations for children to apply their skills.





CYBER AWARENESS

Students and teachers attended very informative workshop sessions presented by Susan McLean on the importance of cyber awareness for all. CYBER BULLYING

Harassing or abusive emails or phone messages, including silent calls. Intimidations or gossip – spread through email or phone messages e.g. sending someone offensive SMS phone texts or posting insulting material on the internet.

Tips to stay safe when online from her presentation included:

- Tell someone if you are being bullied.
- Save and store the emails, chat logs or SMS's in case of a Police investigation.
- Do not respond to nasty emails, chats or SMS's.
- Block and delete a bully from all contact lists.
- Use the 'report abuse' button on websites like Facebook.
- If you are under 13 you should not be on Facebook.
- Check your privacy settings on your social networking site on a regular basis. Remember customise your setting – limit your friend list – don't friend randoms.

Signs a child/person may be being cyber bullied?

- Change in mood and/or behaviour.
- Being extra secretive in online activities.
- 'Jumpy' when text messages arrive.
- Not putting their phone down.
- Wanting to be online all the time....or never.
- Spending more time with family instead of friends.

SCHOOLS TENNIS CLASSIC




