## FROM THE PRINCIPAL

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### WELCOME BACK TO TERM TWO

It's difficult to imagine that we are already in May! Terms Two and Three are traditionally the periods when the hard day to day work of education really occurs. These terms are relatively free from interruptions and they allow students and teachers to really settle into the serious routine of learning and teaching. For our Year 12 students in particular, this period is critical as they pass the half-way point of their courses in a matter of weeks. Mid-year examinations are also looming with all students needing to begin focussing on solid revision.

Several new staff members have joined the College this term. We welcome Ronnie Pedretti, who joins the English Learning Area; Nicole Wright, who will be providing administrative support to the Aboriginal and Boarding area; and Judy Mackintosh who has been appointed as a Home Economics Assistant.

Our first day back this term was particularly special with a whole school assembly to mark ANZAC Day. In a simple but beautifully moving ceremony, our students were given the opportunity to reflect on the terrible nature of work and the incredible sacrifices made by those who have served in Australia's armed forces. Stewart Palmer, our unassuming Maths teacher, performed a powerful ballad at the assembly in honour of his grandfather who fought in World War One and Two. It was also very special to have three of our students, Mitchell Caubo, Rhys Atkins and Alistair Enkel who are Air Force cadets to provide an honour guard for the wreath laying ceremony. My sincere thanks to Nicole Huggins, Chris Vlahov and all staff and students involved with this very special assembly.

### STUDENT UNIFORMS

It was pleasing to see so many students commence the term wearing their College uniform with great pride. One area of concern for me, however, is the length of many girls' skirts. Our regulations require skirts to be worn at or just above the knee. Some girls have obviously grown since last year! There is also a habit exhibited by some girls of rolling up their skirts at the waist and so shortening the length of their skirts.

I have **asked PCAs to provide an initial warning** to those girls who are wearing their skirts too short. If this does not have the desired effect **parents will be contacted by the PCA** requesting that parental intervention occur. If there is still no improvement after this step offending students will receive uniform detentions until such time as the skirt length is appropriate. I would request strong parental support on this matter.

### STAFF OVERSEAS

During this week several of our staff will be representing the College at international gatherings. Natalie Calleja was one of just three women delegates from Australia to be invited to the first Lasallian Symposium for Women being held in Pattaya in Thailand. This inaugural gathering of Lasallian women brings delegates from around the world to look at Lasallian spirituality. It is also being attended by the Superior General of the Brothers, Br Alvaro. My congratulations to Natalie on this honour.

Rino Randazzo and Lindy Reger are also away this week presenting to a conference of Lasallian educators at La Salle College in Kowloon, Hong Kong. This symposium brings together leading schools in the area of ICT. Apart from sharing many of the positive developments and initiatives related to ICT at La Salle here in Middle Swan, Lindy and Rino will also have an opportunity to learn how other Lasallian schools from around the Asian region are responding to the digital age.

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### **BALGO SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAMME**

All reports from the annual trip to Balgo have been incredibly positive. This is the third year that a group of students and staff have travelled to Balgo to run a school holiday programme for the children in the community. I would like to record my thanks to the five staff members who supported our students - Adrian Martino, Kristy Meyers, Terry Gosling, Rachael Langdon and Kylie Paskov. Thank you also to the twenty Year 11 students who so willingly gave up their April holidays to undertake this outstanding act of service by touching the hearts of the Balgo children.




### **THE MIKADO**



# FROM The Chaplain



"Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any one hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me."  
(Rev 3:20)

For me, a picture of Jesus knocking at the door is the best and the most powerful image of the Sacrament of Reconciliation during which Jesus gently knocks on the door of human heart and patiently awaits to be invited in. He cannot force himself inside because the door does not have a handle from the outside. It is the person who is inside the house that has to open the door for Jesus.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is just that; opening the door for Jesus, inviting him into our hearts, our homes, our families and our society.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a beautiful sign of God's love and mercy which is offered to us through Jesus Christ who suffered and died for our sins. He rose from the dead so we can also rise to new life as God's children by the power of his love and forgiveness.

During the April school holidays, Year 11 students Mariam Fornah and Dennielle Massang had the exciting opportunity to participate in The Amanda Young Foundation Young Leaders Eco Health Summit.

The four day residential summit, held at Penrhos College, was for Year 11 students from all over WA who display potential leadership skills. Mariam and Dennielle took part in a variety of interactive sessions on team building and leadership, discovering the qualities of a good leader, how to set clear goals and motivate themselves, and the importance of interpersonal skills as a tool for success.

They met and were inspired by the personal stories of a variety of speakers, including 2007 WA Young Leader of the Year, Josh Fernandez and meningococcal disease survivor, Lisa Burnette.

The Summit is run by The Amanda Young Foundation, a charity set up in 1998 in memory of Amanda, a woman of unlimited potential who died at 18 from meningococcal disease. The Foundation is committed to developing young people as leaders in our community.

Meningococcal disease is a bacterial infection that can kill within 24 hours and targets adolescents and young adults. ### **RAC DRIVER ENHANCEMENT COURSE**

Young drivers are involved in around 30% of all serious and fatal accidents – even though they only make up 14% of the population. The first six months that P-plates are out on the roads by themselves is the most dangerous time. Over-confidence and inexperience are key factors in this.

The RAC Driving Centre aims to teach safe driving behaviours through practical hands-on tuition within the students own vehicle. The four hour RAC Driver Enhancement Course provides driver training in a safe environment coupled with classroom style learning. The course reinforces the dangers faced by young drivers and teaches them the driving behaviours necessary to stay safe behind the wheel.

We believe by partnering with RAC we can help our students to be better, safer drivers. I would encourage you to consider the participation of your child.

The initial Driver Enhancement Course will be conducted for Year 12 students holding a current driver's license. The cost of the course has been discounted for La Salle College students at \$175.50 (GST exempt), usually \$195 per person. # N O C K C L I C K



There are some questions we're answering over and over again. These answers may not, of course, cover every event, but are common remedies that work in most cases.

**“My laptop is doing funny stuff, won't work, etc”.**

- Before anything else, try a Restart.

**“I charged my battery all night and it went flat in 2 hours.”**

- Make sure it is actually charging. The power point must be switched on and check that the cord has **not pulled out of the transformer** (black box). Look for the charging symbol to show.
- If you're using heavy processor software as is the case in some Info Tech courses, bring your power cord.
- Genuine faulty batteries need to be verified by NOC staff and replaced.



**“My school laptop won't connect to our home network.”**

- Make sure the switch for your wireless antenna is on (it's on the side of the laptop)
- Click the  icon (lower right hand side of screen) and select your home network. You'll need your home password.

**“I can't get internet at home on my school laptop.”**

- First you must be connected to your home network, see above. Then you must “untick the proxy.” Do it this way:
- Open Internet Explorer [tools |internet options|connections|LAN settings, and untick the box next to “Use a proxy server ....”
- Press OK to confirm.



**“I can't get internet at home on my school laptop because I use a “dongle”**

(wireless 3G internet USB device supplied by telecommunications companies like Telstra).

- Bring the laptop and dongle to the NOC and the staff will set it up for you.

**“I can't get school email at home.”**

- Open the La Salle College website.
- Under links choose La Salle Webmail.
- Your username is your FULL SCHOOL EMAILADDRESS.
- Your password is your school network password.
- This should work on any device that can access internet.

**“I can't get Simon at home.”**

- Open the La Salle College website.
- Under links choose Simon [external].
- Your username is your name code. Eg. Fred Rogerson would be 'rogerf'.
- Your password is your school network password.




