TRAFFIC AND PARKING MANAGEMENT

The City of Swan has written to the College outlining a number of changes which will need to occur with regard to traffic and parking management around the College. A letter will be emailed to parents/guardians next week outlining the requirements. By way of summary the following will come into effect from the middle of June:

- ✍ all drop off and pick up of students must take place in La Salle Avenue.
- ✍ the 'kiss and drop' zone will be extended along the length of La Salle Avenue.
- ✍ no parking will be allowed along La Salle Avenue.
- ✍ no pick up or drop off will be allowed in the parking area adjacent to the Canteen, with the exception of students in the Education Support Centre.

Your co-operation in implementing these mandated changes is requested.


MID YEAR EXAMS



YEAR 10 STUDENTS – JOB GUIDE

You may be aware that in the past, each Year 10 student has received a copy of the Job Guide to use in CDT classes here at school and then to bring home and keep as a resource for their future Career development. Unfortunately this year, the Australian Government has changed the distribution of the Job Guides to schools and Year 10 students will **not** be receiving a copy of the Job Guide from 2012 and beyond. My preference is that students' access the Job Guide using the website: www.jobguide.deewr.gov.au where it is regularly updated and current. I have copied the reply from DEEWR regarding this, for your information.

The Australian Government recognises that the Job Guide is seen as a valuable resource for looking up a range of occupations and the related education and training pathway. In 2012 there is a change of distribution to the Job Guide... We are now moving to class sets for students to share within classes, rather than one per Year 10 student. In today's digital learning environment, young people are embracing online resources as a preferred method of accessing information. This change of distribution reflects this preference as well as resulting in a greener approach to producing the Job Guide. Due to this policy change, we are no longer printing as many hard copies of the Job Guides, therefore I am sorry to say that we do not have additional hard copies available for your school.

We also understand that to support your planned career programme your institution, students or parents may choose to purchase hard copies of the Job Guide 2012.... This can be done directly from our publisher Hobsons by calling their toll free number to place an order – 1800 682 133. In addition many newsagents also stock Job Guide.

“Néih hóu” which is “hello” in Cantonese! Mr Rino Randazzo and I have recently returned from Hong Kong where we presented two workshops on how our College rolled out the 1:1 digital learning programme. This move has fundamentally changed the delivery of education and the way in which our students learn. Our trip was also an amazing learning journey for both of us in terms of cultural experiences, urban living and education in a Hong Kong context.

There are eight Lasallian schools in Hong Kong and Kowloon (known as the New Territories). We visited three of these schools - St Joseph's College established in 1875, La Salle Primary commissioned in 1957 and La Salle College which opened in 1932. The latter hosted the mLearning Education Symposium. The symposium was attended by 800 participants with numerous keynote speakers and workshop presenters from Hong Kong, America, mainland China, the Philippines, Singapore and of course, we represented Western Australia!

Each day 1 600 students - all boys - enter the front gates of La Salle College, passing a huge banner advertising the College's 80th Jubilee and a statue of St John Baptist de La Salle. The base of this statue is surrounded by New Zealand grass (a rarity in Hong Kong). Students commence their secondary education in Form 1 - the equivalent of our Year 7 and finish in Form 6 - the equivalent of our Year 12. The school day starts at 8:00 am with 1½ hours for lunch! During our tour of the College we were fortunate to attend the 'English Arena', a free lunchtime public speaking performance. In keeping with the mLearning theme, Form 3 students read palm card notes from their mobile phones, presenting their speeches in English and delivering well researched, thought provoking current topics.

The Education Symposium was aimed at stimulating dialogue on how mobile and electronic technologies can be used as powerful teaching and learning tools in curriculum delivery. Teachers, educators, past students (representing the La Salle College Old Boys' Association), current students and parents were provided with an impressive programme of keynote speakers, forums, workshops, demonstrations and papers. In addition there were vendors' booths and exhibitions to browse, including the breathtaking 'Moving Tapestry', a digitally produced timeline tracing the history of St John Baptist de La Salle and La Salle College, Kowloon.

The opening keynote speaker, Mr Kim Lengel from City University of New York, presented how a student in today's world may complete assigned tasks. He used a snapshot view from one day in a student's school life and provided the audience with practical examples of how technology can be used to build knowledge and understanding. A live video link-up in the opening session included students from Beibei Teachers' Training College in Chongqing, China and St Francis High School in Taiwan. The afternoon keynote speakers included Mr Kenneth Chan, Undersecretary for Education of the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and Mr Karl Engkvist, the Senior Vice President of Business Development for Pearson Asia Pacific. The concluding speech was delivered by Dr Randy Yerrick, Professor of Science Education and Associate Dean of Educational Technology at State University of New York, Buffalo. These keynote speakers certainly provided a “mLearning 'Ideas Exchange' on the impact of IT on the quality of life and on learning for the betterment of the world in the 21st century.”



We take this opportunity to sincerely thank Br Steve Hogan, the Lasallian Brothers, staff and students at the three Lasallian schools and the La Salle College PTA for their wonderful hospitality and kindness extended to us during our stay. “Joigin” or “goodbye” until next we meet.


BEFORE SCHOOL GROUP FITNESS CLASSES


FIRST MEETING WYD RIO 2013 INFORMATION EVENING 23 MAY 7:30 - 8:30 PM
