## WACE REVISION SEMINARS

In order to continue our academic support of all Year 12 students, the College will be organising WACE Revision Seminars which will take place next term.

The WACE Seminars will be presented by Hands on Tuition tutors and will cover all aspects of our Stage 2 and 3 WACE courses.

Students studying these courses are strongly encouraged to attend as a preparation for their Semester 2 College exams and the WACE exams to be held in November.

Many students have already taken advantage of the free seminars offered in terms 1 and 2 – these revision seminars will be an extension of those and will comprehensively cover WACE exam preparation and revision of the whole course.

All seminars are heavily subsidised by the College (normal price \$120 per student) and include detailed notes and exam questions. The cost of attending each course will be \$60 – parents will be billed on the Semester 2 fee statement. Please do not send money with the booking form.

## STUDY SKILLS TIP FOR JUNE: REVIEWING YOUR WORK ON A DAILY BASIS

Did you know that if you don't look at what you are learning for a second time within 24 hours you forget 80% of the detail! This is why your teachers encourage you to review what you learn each day when you get home from school.

One of the best habits you can develop is the following: each afternoon, even before you start your homework, spend 10 - 15 minutes reviewing what you learnt at school that day.

There are lots of different ways you can do this review, here are some ideas (and you can do something different every day):

1. Highlight the key points in each lesson.
2. Write down the top 3 things you learnt in each lesson (you could do this in a separate book or at the bottom of the day's classwork).
3. Make a mind map about what you have been learning in class.
4. Try and explain what you did in each lesson that day to a family member (or even to the cat).
5. Go on a Google adventure, do some quick research on one interesting thing from each lesson.
6. Write up on a white board one main idea from each lesson (a whiteboard in your room is a great tool for secondary students).
7. Write down for each subject a question you could ask about what you learnt that day.

There will be a fabulous payoff to doing this, more of what you learn at school will stick in your head, you will have less to learn at test time, and it will make your assignments and projects easier when you can recall what you have been learning.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

Years 7 - 9 Religious Education students are revising for the upcoming Semester 1 Religion tests/exams, to be held in Week 9. The students are concluding their units of work and are focusing on collating all their work in preparation for next weeks' assessments. We wish them all the very best, and that they achieve their full potential.

Last Sunday we celebrated the Feast of Corpus Christi, or the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (as it is often called today). This feast goes back to the 13th century but it celebrates something far older: the institution of the Sacrament of Holy Communion at the Last Supper. It celebrates the mystery and enduring presence of the Body and Blood of Christ in the Eucharist. (While Holy Thursday is also a celebration of this mystery, the solemn nature of Holy Week and the focus on Christ's Passion on Good Friday overshadows that aspect of Holy Thursday).

While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many."

Wednesday 13 June we celebrated the Feast of St Anthony of Padua. St Anthony is the patron saint of lost items, and we take time to reflect that we perhaps have 'lost our way' with our faith journey. We ask Jesus through our prayers that we may again find our way in unity with the Holy Spirit, and that we may try and live the way Jesus wanted us to live.

# Click on

At La Salle College we promote and encourage our students to become active learners. What is an active learner? It is a learner who takes responsibility for their own learning, is motivated and self-disciplined. This type of learning is encouraged regardless of the technology that our students can access. However, a curriculum that utilises information communications technology (ICT) as a vehicle for powerful learning will promote student participation and actively engage students in their learning.



A recent invitation to visit a Year 7 Science class to discuss the current task on Australian snakes highlighted the use of ICT as a vehicle for powerful learning. The task encouraged students to be actively involved in the learning, to work collaboratively and to be responsible for their learning. These are important skills that our students need as they transition to tertiary study or the workforce on leaving La Salle College.

Students were certainly very enthusiastic about using the JacPLUS educational site. This site offers online digital resources for students and teachers. The students gave it the 'thumbs up' as it helped to direct and guide their learning on the topic, even though they did experience some technological problems with the site. What was clearly evident from interviews with the Year 7 Science students was their ability to problem solve these 'glitches' and share this information with their peers and the teacher.

Students should also be encouraged to become active learners at home. It starts when they are young. Check out a Victorian primary school's page 'My child, the active learner' for ideas @ <http://www.doncasterps.vic.edu.au/starting-school/200/>. As your child grows encourage them to be critical and creative thinkers. Develop your child's use of critical thinking to problem solve. Help them look at themselves honestly, resist distractions, ask good questions and look for connections in their learning. Media can develop critical thinking if used correctly. ## ABSENCES AT SPORTING EVENTS

Unfortunately carnivals always become difficult events for House Coordinators to manage due to the number of student absences that consistently undermine their organisation. Whilst acknowledging that circumstances will sometimes prevent students from competing, it is worth exploring the implications of allowing students to simply opt out of team events:

- ✎ The inconvenience caused to the staff managing the teams;
- ✎ The burden that falls to other students in the House in having to fill the gaps;
- ✎ The disregard for the 'team' aspect of the event and the message this sends.

In many ways, simply insisting that your child fulfils their obligation (and does their best for their House) is all that is asked. Nothing more and nothing less. To withdraw a student to 'save themselves' for weekend commitments is also difficult to fathom - especially at the age of thirteen or fourteen accompanied by an overestimation of their standard of competition.

To further illustrate the inconsideration, House Coordinators are rarely done the courtesy of being informed of these 'absences' in advance or even on the morning of the carnival. Students are simply allowed to not turn up and usually don't apologise post carnival.

We will never have perfect attendance, however a golden opportunity to promote some important values is being missed in some cases.


