

HUMAN SOCIETY INTERNATIONAL MOBILE PHONE RECYCLING PROGRAMME

La Salle College is registered in the Human Society International mobile phone recycling programme. The HSI is the largest animal protection organisation in the world. It has more programmes working around the globe than any other organisation, striving to protect pets and domestic animals as well as wildlife and their environment.

Mobile phones contain a mineral called Coltan which can be recycled. Coltan is being mined in Mountain Gorilla habitats across Africa and the Republic of Congo, destroying habitats and making the Mountain Gorilla a Critically Endangered species.

At home, many families have broken or old mobile phones and are unsure what to do with them. We ask students to bring in old mobile phones with batteries and chargers and place them in the box at Student Reception. The mobile phones will be recycled and parts of the phone will be reused instead of more forest



habitat being destroyed. Also, donations for anti-poaching patrols will be made by the organisation to help protect the last of the Mountain Gorillas.




Vinnies School Sleepout


A Well-Constructed Document is Built in Sections



It's easy to break your MS Word document into sections. Here's how:

Go to where you want to put the border between sections.

On the Page Layout tab, choose Breaks, then Section Breaks. "Next page" is the most useful choice. The next page will be the start of the new section.



So why bother? Because different sections can have different formatting:

Front covers should not contain headers or footers, but the rest of the document may have them. *Headers and footers* may be applied only in the sections they're required.

Page 1 may not be your first page. You may have a cover or a contents page first. The *page numbering* can be made to start from "page 1" in any section.

Diagrams or art work may require some pages to be "landscape" (sideways). You can have different *orientations* in different sections.

You may want a *page border* in some sections and not others.

You may want your text in *columns* in some sections and not others.

Here's an example:



Section 1. Cover with page border.

Section 2. No border.

Section 3. No border, page numbers begin from 1. Possibly a header or footer.

Section 4. Columns.

Section 5. Landscape orientation and background colour.

BACK TO BACK FOR SOLOMON IN ATHLETICS!






The selection for the 14s Development Squad has just begun and we anticipate another good representation in that squad.
