
NATIONAL EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AWARD 2013

Year 7-10 Assessments

The Year 7 - 10 Religious Education classes only have one formal assessment this term, which is the Semester 2 Exam.

Please note, according to Section 6 of the Assessment Policy, students who are absent for an exam due to:

- illness – must provide a medical certificate to avoid scoring zero.
- family holiday – will receive a zero score.
- exceptional circumstances – up to the discretion of the Deputy Principal - Teaching, Learning & Innovation.

If a student misses an exam due to a school-related absence (excursion, carnival, etc) they will complete the assessment during their next RE lesson with no penalties.

Year 11 and 12

It's the end of an era for our Year 12 students who have now finished school. We wish them all the best for their upcoming examinations.

Year 11 have another two weeks of school prior to commencing exams. All students enrolled in a regular Religious Education classroom programme participate in the Common Assessment Task. This exam is produced by the Catholic Education Office of Western Australia and assesses the Religion and Life unit – both 1B and 2B.

Year 9 Incursion – Building Healthy Relationships

As part of the Year 9 Religious Education programme this term, the students will be participating in an incursion on either Thursday 7 November or Thursday 14 November. This is led by *Catholic Marriage and Fertility Services* and is an interactive presentation that explores the skills, knowledge and attitudes required to establish and maintain relationships through the teen years and into the future. LYNN SCHOLARSHIP FOR YEARS 11 & 12 IN A CATHOLIC SCHOOL

The Lynn Scholarship was established to provide financial assistance to students in the Archdiocese of Perth who might be deprived of an upper secondary education in a Catholic school because of the economic or social circumstances of the family.

To be eligible, the student must currently be completing Year 10 at a Catholic school and intend to complete Years 11 and 12 at a Catholic school. The value of the scholarship will be up to \$500 per annum and is payable for two years.

The conditions of the scholarship and the application form and a Principal's Statement form are attached to the Delagram. Applications should be received by the Lynn Scholarship Committee at the Catholic Education Office of WA no later than Friday 15 November 2013.



ONLINE Your Reputation

- 1 **Set your profile to PRIVATE.** Parents, you'd be surprised at how many young people refuse to do this. It calls into question whether they're mature enough to be given the technology.
- 2 **Be fussy** about who is your friend. Unfriend those who could harm your online reputation.
- 3 **Go find yourself.** Regularly! Search yourself on the web. www.pipl.com is a good place to do this. See what others can see.
- 4 **Dob.** Report offensive online behaviour or fake profiles. Block what you don't like. Life is better in a clean house.
- 5 **Avoid association** with offensive groups and never "like" offensive comments. Remember it will be taken out of context in the future.
- 6 **Nothing inappropriate** should ever originate from you, be passed on by you or be allowed to remain on your device or your account. This particularly applies to images of a sexual nature which can lead to criminal charges and serious long term consequences. And, no, SnapChat is not secure. Google SnapHack.
- 7 **How many** of you are there? Delete unused accounts.
- 8 **Bluetooth off** when not specifically in use.
- 9 **Where are you?** Disable the GPS tagging feature in your camera. If you don't, others can see the location of where your photos are taken (accurate to 3 metres)
- 10 If you wouldn't like **that silly picture** to be in the paper or on TV, don't put it on online.


