##### **November Masses for the Deceased**



For the past three Fridays this term, members of the Western Australia United Nations Youth Association came to help us run our own Model United Nations. We were allocated different member countries of the UN Security Council and debated topics relating to child and refugee rights. It helped us to understand how the real United Nations functions. Doing a model United Nations brought to our attention how difficult it is to protect people's rights and how powerless third world countries can be. On 1 November we had our United Nations Assessment where we debated the rights of refugees for roughly one hour before we took a vote on the final resolution. At this vote, the United States of America (represented by Matthew Arnold and Alex Lambert) used their veto power to block the passing of the resolution. Before this, we did not realise the power that some of the countries held and so we now understand why there are so many human right breaches in society.
