

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Dear La Salle community members

BAD THINGS HAPPEN WHEN GOOD PEOPLE DO NOTHING

A continuing theme that I have emphasised to our students this year has been the importance of looking out for each other. In a society that has become increasingly focused on 'self' there has been a decline in people showing care and support for others. The essence of community is a real commitment by its members to demonstrate awareness of the needs of others and a willingness to get involved when required. When people ignore the plight of others there is a deterioration in the common good.

To paraphrase the 18th century statesman, Edmund Burke, "bad things happen when good people do nothing." It is simply not enough to refrain from an evil action. To ignore wrongs or pretend that they have not occurred displays a weakness of character and an abandonment of our obligations as community members.

In a school community centred on Christ we are challenged in the Gospels to "love one another as I have loved you." We must be active in reaching out to the disadvantaged and marginalised.

I have been delighted to hear from many staff, while also observing first hand, the willingness of many of our students to "step up" and show their concern for others in our school community. I congratulate those students who have gone out of their way to "touch hearts" by reaching out to others who have been at risk or troubled. I challenge those students who have ignored the plight of fellow students to be inspired by the example of St John Baptist de La Salle and really seek to be there for others and ensure that our school continues to be a community based on respect and compassion.

STUDY SKILLS TIP FOR MARCH: REVIEWING YOUR WORK ON A DAILY BASIS

Did you know that if you don't look at what you are learning for a second time within 24 hours you forget 80% of the detail! This is why your teachers encourage you to review what you learn each day when you get home from school.

One of the best habits you can develop is the following:

Each afternoon, even before you start your homework, spend 10 - 15 minutes reviewing what you learnt at school that day.

There are lots of different ways you can do this review, here are some ideas (and you can do something different every day):

1. Highlight the key points in each lesson.
2. Write down the top 3 things you learnt in each lesson (you could do this in a separate book or at the bottom of the day's classwork).
3. Make a mind map about what you have been learning in class.
4. Try and explain what you did in each lesson that day to a family member (or even to the cat).
5. Go on a Google adventure, do some quick research on one interesting thing from each lesson.
6. Write up on a white board one main idea from each lesson (a whiteboard in your room is a great tool for secondary students).
7. Write down for each subject a question you could ask about what you learnt that day.

There will be a fabulous payoff to doing this, more of what you learn at school will stick in your head, you will have less to learn at test time, and it will make your assignments and projects easier when you can recall what you have been learning.

The Year 9 programme will also begin in Week 5 and students will receive their diaries next week.



SWIM-A-THON

The annual Swim-A-Thon is on Thursday 21 March (week 7) in the Matthew Kennedy Aquatic Centre. The Swim-A-Thon is an enjoyable fundraising event where each year group will be allocated a period during the day to swim as many laps for their House as possible.

Each student will receive a sponsorship form on Monday 11 March during morning PCG. There are two sponsorship options, with the first being a donation that can be given, and the second where family members and friends can make a pledge towards the total amount of laps that their House swims. All the money raised from the event will be added to the profits of Mission Aid Day. Proceeds go to the Lasallian Foundation, supporting third world countries, underprivileged children and communities in nations such as India, Sri Lanka, Papua New Guinea, Thailand and Pakistan. Last year, the College raised approximately \$14 000 and we hope to raise even more this year to assist this worthy cause. Students are asked to collect the money they have raised and return their sponsorship forms by 3 April. Forms need to be returned regardless of whether a donation is obtained or not. As with previous years, any student who raises over \$20 for the event will go into the draw to win an iPad2.

Last year, La Salle House took out first place with 1 257 laps, however, it's a new year, and we look forward to seeing some friendly competition and maybe even the rise of a new winning House for 2013. We also hope that the school can do even better than our 2012 total of 8 242 laps (that's 206.05 km) for the day. The SRC encourages all students to swim as many laps as they can at this year's Swim-A-Thon. This will help their House swim the farthest distance and raise the most money for the Lasallian Foundation!


