AWARD OF EXCELLENCE IN CATHOLIC EDUCATION

I am delighted to announce that Patricia McGregor and the St Joseph's Education Support Centre have been awarded an Award of Excellence in Catholic Education. The award recognises the innovative and comprehensive Enterprise Programme conducted for students in our Centre. Tricia will receive a trophy for the College and a cheque for \$5 000 to go towards further development of the project. Congratulations to Tricia and all staff and students of our Education Support Centre.

YEAR 7, 2015 ENROLMENTS

The College has commenced the enrolment process for our Year 7 intake, 2015. A series of enrolment information and interview evenings have been held for children in our surrounding Catholic primary schools. We will also be inviting other Catholic children, and their parents, who do not attend Catholic primary schools to attend an interview early next term. After these interviews have been completed we will commence the task of offering places at the College. At the present time we already have a significant excess of applications for the 240 places that are available for 2015. If previous trends are any indication, we could expect another 100 applications over the next two years. Please, if you have a son or daughter who is currently in Year 5 at the moment, you will need to fill out an application for enrolment form as soon as possible. There is no automatic entry into La Salle College. The first requirement is that we have an enrolment application for your child!

YEAR 7, 2014 SCHOLARSHIP EXAM

Last Saturday approximately 70 students sat our Year 7, 2014 Scholarship Exam. This test, set and marked by the Australian College for Educational Research, will be used to identify those outstanding academic students who will be offered scholarships. I would like to record my thanks to Angela Johnson, our Learning Area Coordinator – Learning Support, for her organisation of the exam and Adrian Martino and Lina Valkoff for their supervision of students.

ACC SWIMMING CARNIVAL

Last Monday our students competed in the 'C Division' ACC Swimming Carnival. Overall, the team gained 3rd place. The girls were second overall, with the juniors winning the Junior Girls' Shield. MOCK TRIALS



This year, La Salle College has entered to take part in the 27th Inter-School Mock Trials Competition. The competition is run by the Law Society of WA and students compete in courtrooms in the Supreme Court. Each trial consists of 2 teams from 2 schools which play the part plaintiff/prosecution or defence. Each team then consists of 6 members – 2 barristers, 2 witnesses, 1 solicitor, 1 judge's associate/court orderly. La Salle entered 4 teams this year – Justice League, The Apprentices, The Punishers and White Collar. Students range from Year 10 - 12.

In Round 1, La Salle was given the role of 'defence'. In this case, the barristers had to argue that the defendant was not guilty of an alleged assault occasioning bodily harm. The defendant was a teacher of a high school who was said to have assaulted his student in a Science class. Students spent just another a month practising for their trials and many spent hours before school, during lunchtimes and after school to improve and perfect their skills.

With the help of our coach this year, Prosecutor, Sergeant Phil Milne from the Midland Police Centre, we won 3 out of our 4 trials – beating Melville Senior High School, All Saints College and St Mary's Anglican Girls School, and lost to Perth Modern School. In particular,

Year 11 students Rachel Lendich and Angelo Rechichi were commended for their excellent performance by the Mock Trials Coordinator.

DISCOVERING WHAT'S ON OUR DOORSTEP

Students in the Year 10 Business Management and Enterprise course recently had an opportunity to tour the Swan Valley, gaining firsthand knowledge about the different tourism industry sectors and the types of businesses operating in our local area. As part of their studies, students also investigated the economic benefits of tourism to the Swan Valley region. Mrs Sasha Stone, Tourism Marketing Officer for the City of Swan, accompanied students providing them with a detailed commentary and much useful information about the topic of tourism. Destinations included the Swan Valley Visitor Centre in Guildford, the historic Sandalford Winery - established in 1840, Margaret River Chocolate Factory, Yahava Koffee, Oggies Ice Cream Café and Lolly Shop, the Swan Valley Cuddly Animal Farm - a firm favourite with students as they were able to hand feed the lambs and kids and nurse the smaller animals, The Novotel Vines Resort, and finishing the day at The House of Honey. Students can now apply what they gained from the excursion to a number of tasks, including the creation of a two-day travel itinerary and tourism package for the Swan Valley, and a travel expo later in the year. BUZZ DANCE THEATRE EXCURSION



On 14 March the Year 10 - 12 dance students were privileged to view an incredible performance by Buzz Dance Theatre 'Look the other way'. This captivating piece of work, explored the very real concept of boat people. Can we really classify these people as illegal immigrants? Living in Australia, can we fully grasp the concept of fear? Or is fleeing your country due to poverty, persecution and terrorising destruction a good enough reason? Through Cadi McCarthy's fusion of contemporary dance, hip hop and breakdancing, the dancers tackled an amalgamation of fast paced and highly demanding work as a sign of desperation and complete need, in contrast to slow repetitive movements, symbolising the habit of feeling unsafe, but simply unable to do anything about it. The simplistic but effective costumes, lighting, set and props, was symbolic of the bare minimum owned by these immigrants, reinforced by the voice overs of true stories told by immigrants to create an atmosphere of understanding, connection and realism. The dance work follows the journey of immigrants forced to flee from countries such as Southern Sudan, Afghanistan, Iran, Uganda, Italy and Liberia to Australia the 'Lucky Country', due to war, political unrest, fear and natural disaster. Coalescing stories from recent immigrants now attending Aranmore College, and personal history stories from the dancers made this piece very real for the audience, and took them on a journey of strength, perseverance and determination.



ACCESSING COLLEGE EMAIL OFF-SITE


When a student is not at school, the new version of Outlook and computer set-up requires students to access the College email from via the Web App. This is found at College Website|Links|LaSalle Webmail. Click the radio button as shown below and enter login details. The word academic then backslash must precede the student log in name as shown.

The design of Outlook Web App 2013 is a little different, but all the usual functions are there.



Remember to regularly clean up your mailbox. You can store emails away from outlook by dragging them into the folder of your choice. Attachments consume mailbox space – they should be saved elsewhere and the email can be deleted. Just right-click on the attachment and 'Save As'.

THE DO NOT CALL REGISTER

Protect your home phone, your mobiles and your children(s) mobile phones from unwanted soliciting. Register the numbers at <https://www.donotcall.gov.au/> or phone 1300 792 958. Be careful to only use the above site for this. Do not click alternate routes via emails. There are hoaxes going around that may potentially misuse a phone number.

WINDOWS 8 TIPS


Windows 8 is great as a touch-screen interface, but a good deal of our usage is still better with a mouse and keyboard.





Open Internet Explorer. Click on the settings wheel (top right) and select “Internet options.”


Under 'connections' click 'LAN settings'.


