

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAMME – SEEKING HOST FAMILIES

Welcoming a language student is a once in a life time opportunity! Accepting a student gives you the perfect opportunity to learn about another culture combined with promoting our Australian lifestyle whilst developing new friendships!

Your daily routine will include your host brother or sister attending school with you and participating in extra curricula activities as they arise. The language students immerse themselves into your family and school allowing both of you to explore other cultures, absorb other ideas and, as a result, improve in compassion and insight.

Nacel Australia would like to hear from compassionate families who have a genuine interest in other cultures and are interested in hosting a language student this June, July or August.

All students are monitored by Nacel Australia local Western Australia coordinators for the duration of the programme, have medical insurance and 24/7 emergency contact included. Nacel Australia's local Western Australia coordinator will provide pastoral care for the students throughout their stay and will maintain contact with the school and host family. The Western Australia coordinator will also assist with all arrivals and departures and liaise with the host families for these arrangements.

The student is required to pay for all expenses related to school uniform, textbooks and subject resource charges, public transport to and from school, outings, excursions, personal and incidental spending. The students and their natural parents are made fully aware of their obligation to meet these costs prior to their departure.

Nacel Australia will interview the family, manage working with children checks and provide guidelines for both the host family and the school regarding the programme.

La Salle College is in a position to accept an Exchange student if a suitable host family can be found. Nacel Australia has advised us that a 17 year old Italian girl could possibly be available. 





Big Screen. Your audience watches the show




Small screen "presenter view" giving you control




