

Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment

The Year 9 students participated in the Bishops' Religious Literacy Assessment (BRLA) this week on Tuesday 28 July. This assessment is developed by the Catholic Education Office of Western Australia and is administered to students in Catholic schools across Western Australia.

The BRLA provides a 'point in time', snapshot of student performance in Religious Education (RE). Students' knowledge and understanding of the content of the RE curriculum is assessed using a combination of multiple choice, short and extended response items in the four areas of Jesus, Bible, Sacraments and Prayer, and Church. Students' faith is not assessed. The use of the BRLA complements the school based assessment programs in RE.

This year the BRLA was completed online for the first time. I would like to thank Ms Sharon Cusack and Mr Danny Battistessa for the preparation involved in both the organisation and administration of this assessment.





Legal Use Of Images



Students, staff & parents – we all expect to be able to illustrate our work with suitable photos, clipart and other images.


It's easy – just go to the image section of Google or Bing, type in what you want, copy image or use the snipping tool and there it is!




